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ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION

The state health resource center is an autonomous organization which was design as a additional technical support capacity to the ministry of health and family welfare Chhattisgarh.

HISTORY OF SHRC

In year 2001, Government of Chhattisgarh initiated measures to strengthen the health system of Chhattisgarh and announced a statewide programme of Community Health Workers called Mitandin Programme. SHRC was conceptualized as a collaboration between Government and civil society in order to provide necessary technical support to the health department for designing and implementing health sector reforms in the state including community-based health programmes like Mitandin. The health department entered a MoU with ActionAid India, a civil society organization for setting up SHRC. SHRC was registered as an autonomous society in 2004. It has a 17-member Governing Board including three ex-officio members from health department. SHRC has an MOU with the State Health Society of Chhattisgarh government and the MoU is renewed periodically. Since its inception SHRC has been working together with the health department in areas of community processes and health-systems strengthening.

Since the inception of the programme in 2002, more than 60,000 Mitandins have been trained. The efforts at creating this community-based network has been supplemented by strengthening the larger health system in the State

Objectives of the Mitandin programme:

- Health Education and Improved public awareness of health issues
- Improved Utilization of existing public health care services.
- Initiating collective community level action for health and related development sectors.
- Provision of immediate relief for common health problems
- Organizing women for health action and building up the process as a process of women's empowerment
- Sensitizing panchayats and build up its understanding and capabilities in local health planning and programme implementation

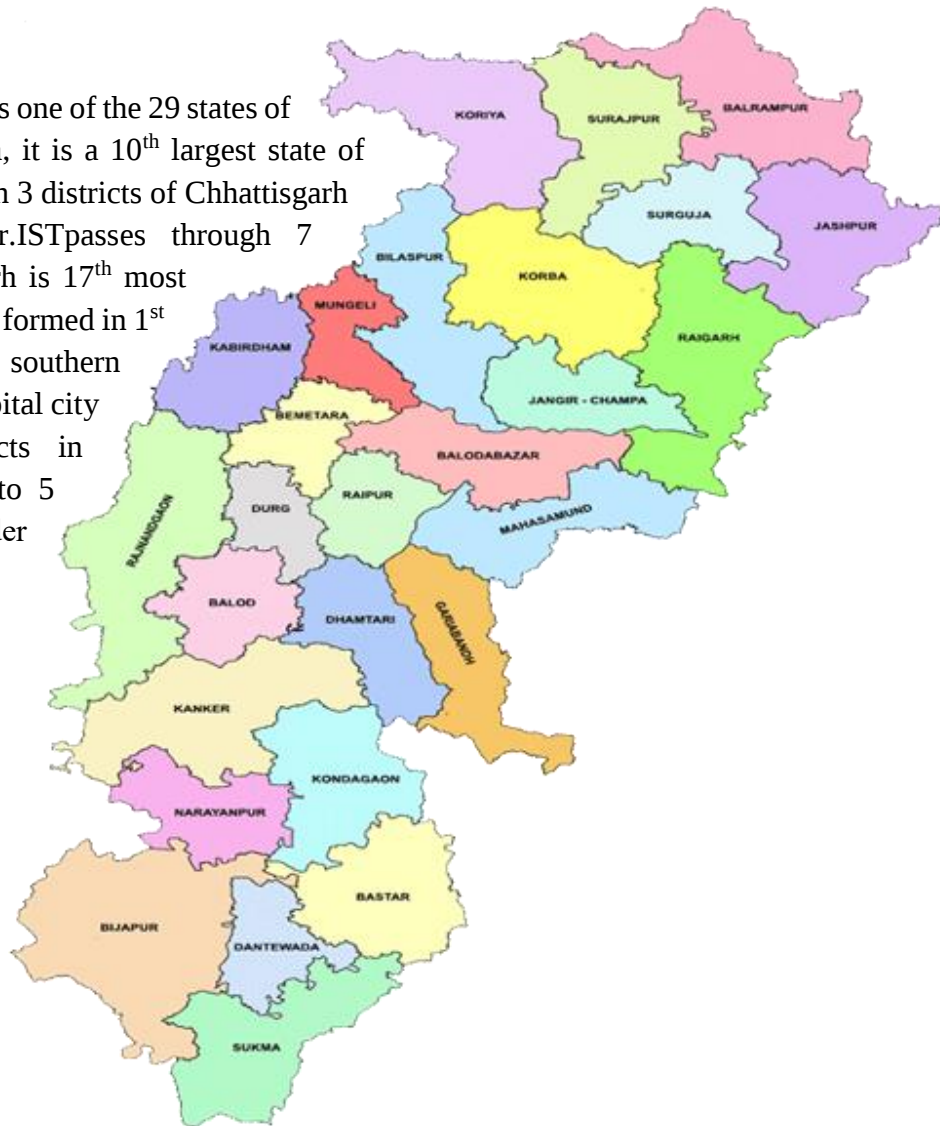
