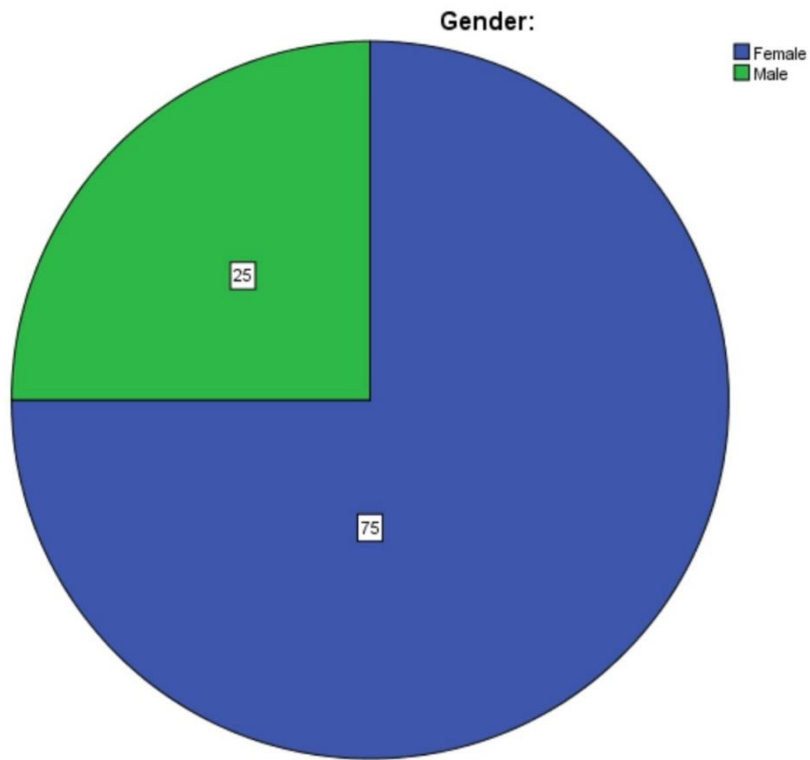

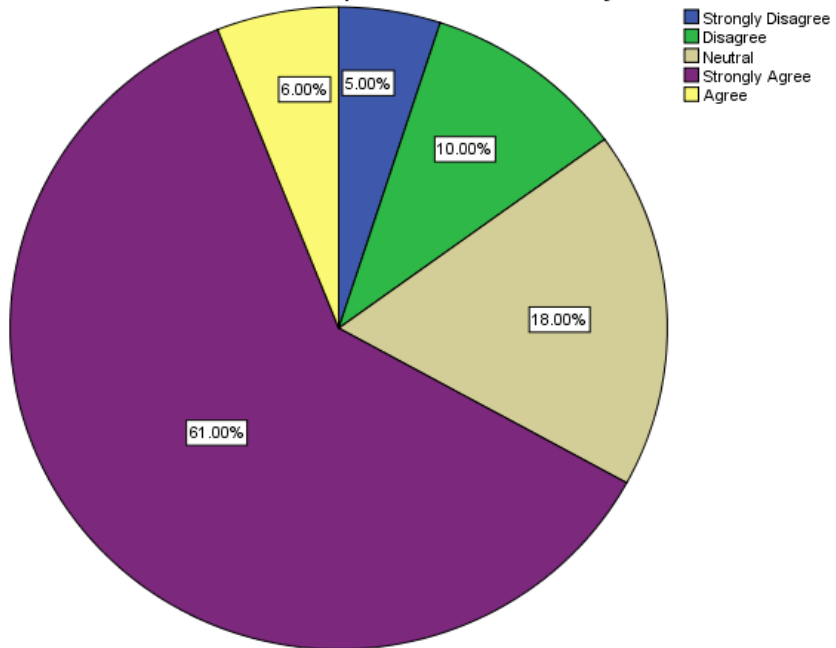
DATA ANALYSIS



Based on the data collected, the gender breakdown is as follows:

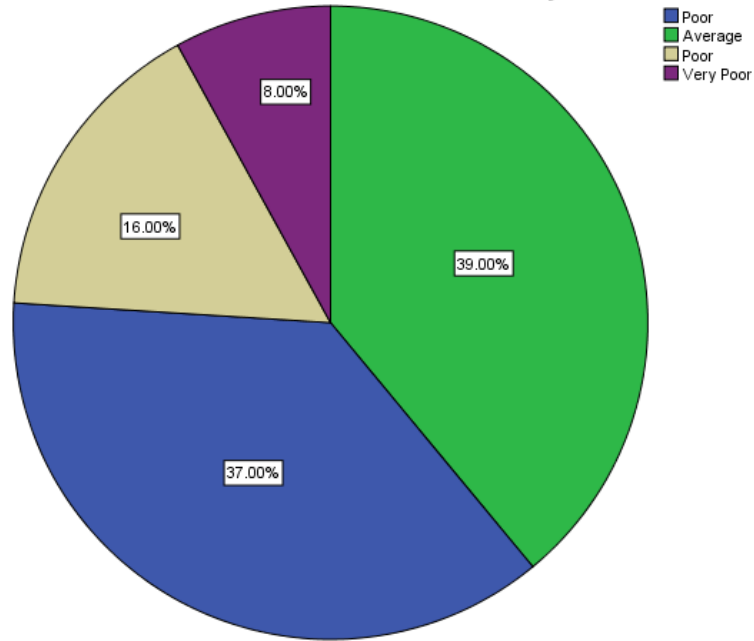
- Female: 75 (75%)

It appears that the majority of respondents (61%) strongly agree that institution building performs an important role at the growth of the local area. Nonetheless, that is a range of opinions, including those who disagree (10%), are neutral (18%), or agree (6%) to a lesser extent.

How would you rate the contribution of RGAVP in building and strengthening institutions at the community level?



It appears that there is a range of opinions regarding the contribution of RGAVP in building and strengthening institutions at the community level. A significant portion of respondents rated it as poor (37%) or average (39%). Additionally, a smaller proportion of respondents rated it as very poor (16%) or poor (8%).

FINDINGS

Overall, the findings suggest that RGAVP's capacity building programs have generally enhanced the skills and capabilities of community members to a moderate to great extent. However, the extent of enhancement may vary among individuals, and there is no significant relationship between gender, educational qualifications, and the perception of RGAVP's contribution to building and strengthening institutions at the community level.

SUGGESTIONS

2. Collect additional data on program outcomes: Include measures of employment, income, and community engagement.
3. Seek feedback from program participants: Gather feedback through surveys and focus group discussions to improve program design.
4. Foster collaboration and partnerships: Collaborate with other organizations for rigorous program evaluations.

LIMITATIONS

1. Sample size and representativeness: Limited sample size and potential lack of representation.
2. Self-reported data: Potential bias due to self-reporting of outcomes.
3. Causality and confounding factors: Correlation analysis does not establish causality; other factors may influence outcomes.
4. Potential measurement limitations: Consider reliability and validity of measures used.
5. Limited scope of analysis: Other factors like program design and community dynamics may impact program effectiveness.

CONCLUSION

- In conclusion, this study on institution building for community development with reference to RGAVP has shed light on the impact of RGAVP's capacity building programs on community members.
- The findings indicate that RGAVP's programs have enhanced the skills and capabilities of community members to a moderate to great extent.
