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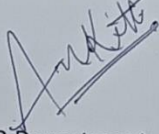

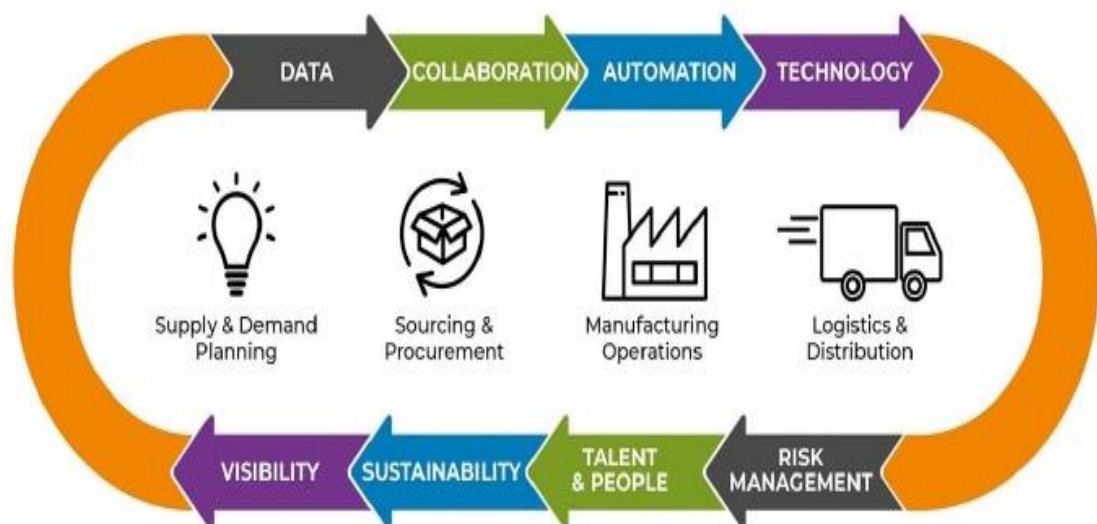


Figure 2 Supply chain Management

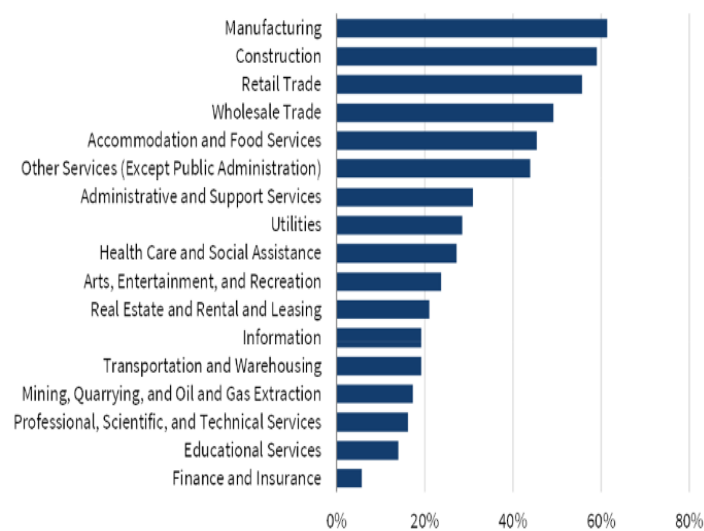

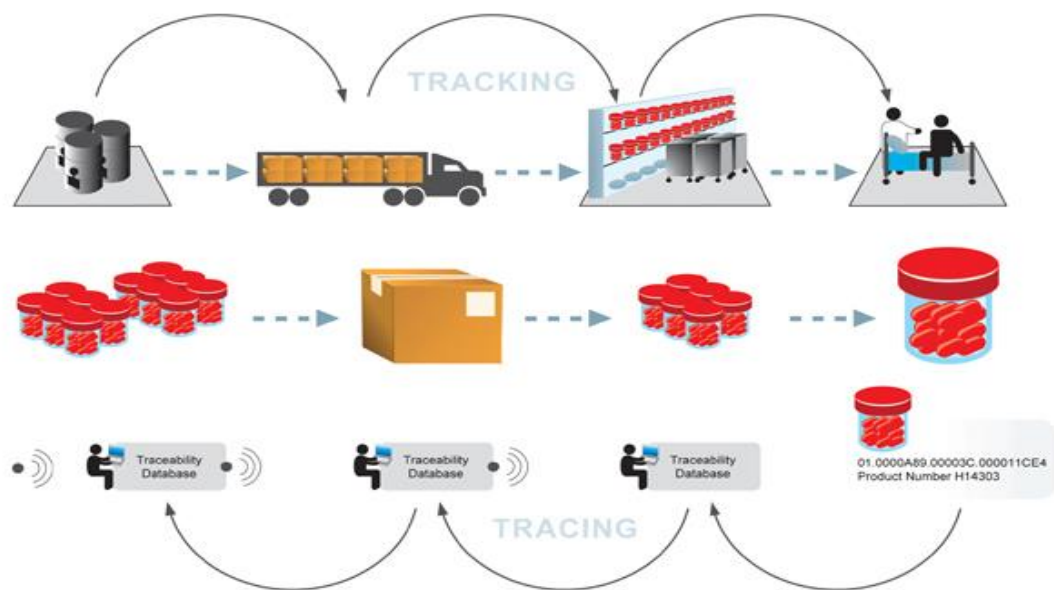


Figure 4 Distribution chain in Health Care Industry

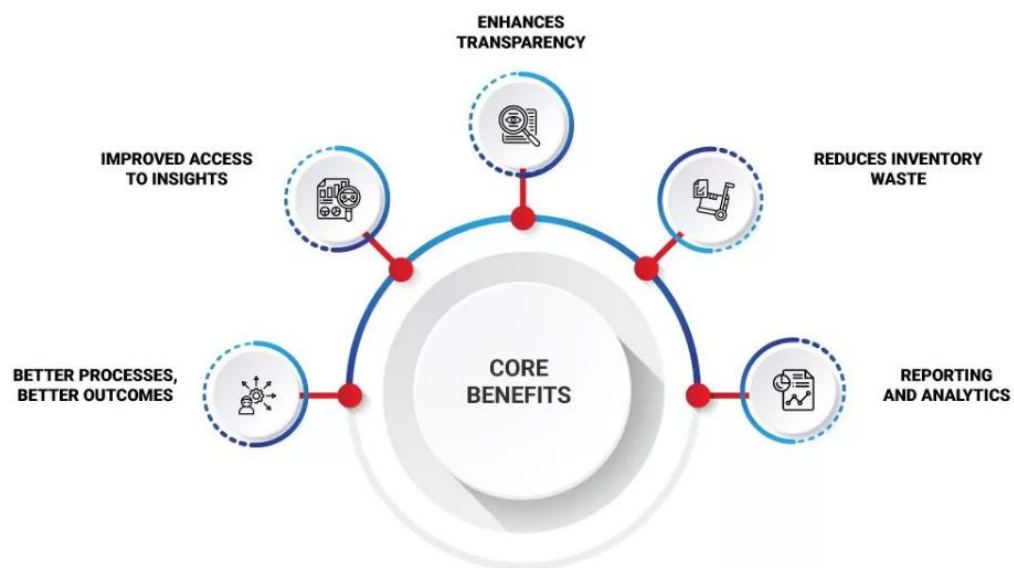


Figure 5: Core Benefits of Healthy Distribution chain

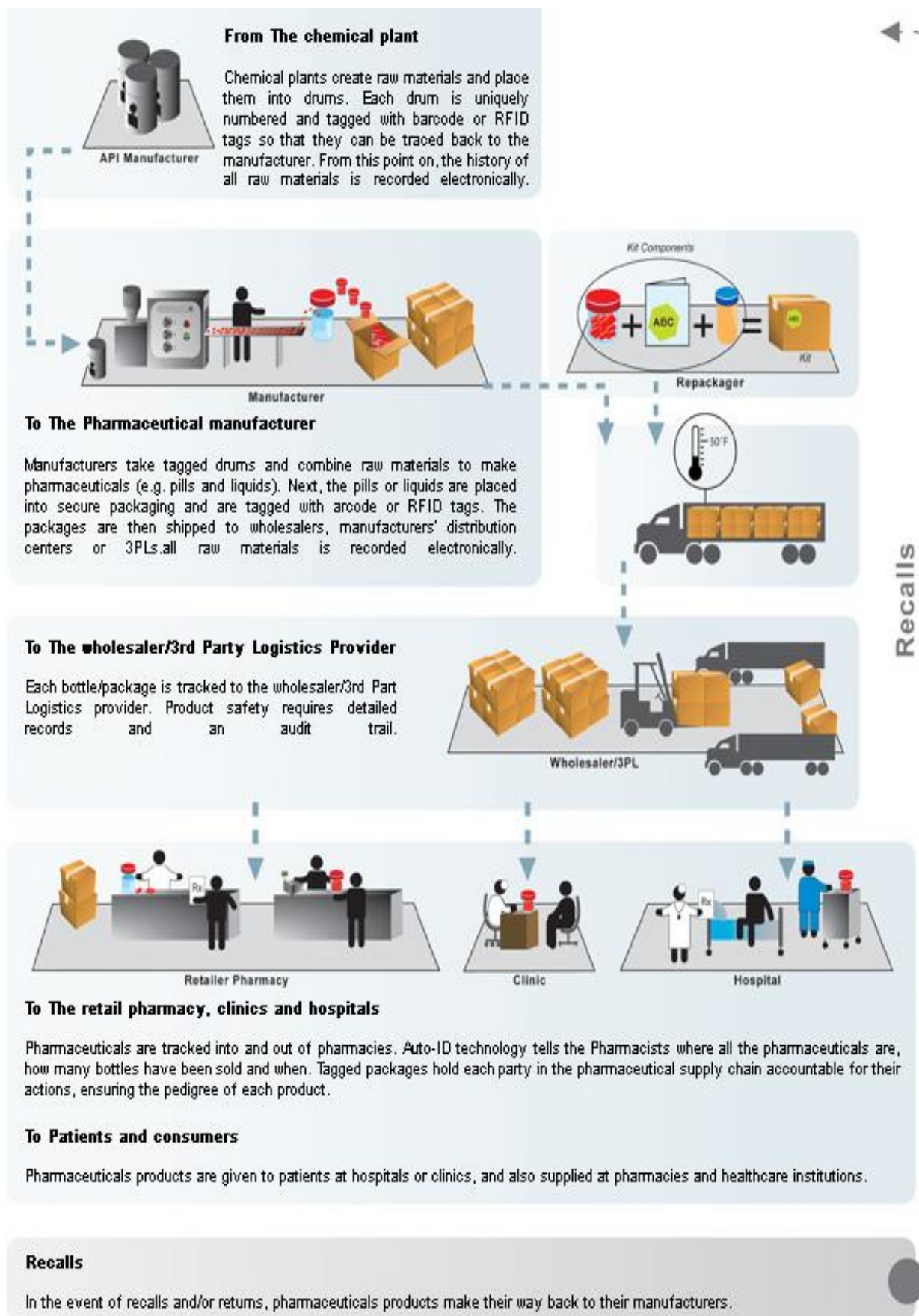


Figure 6 Distribution chain for Pharmaceutical Products

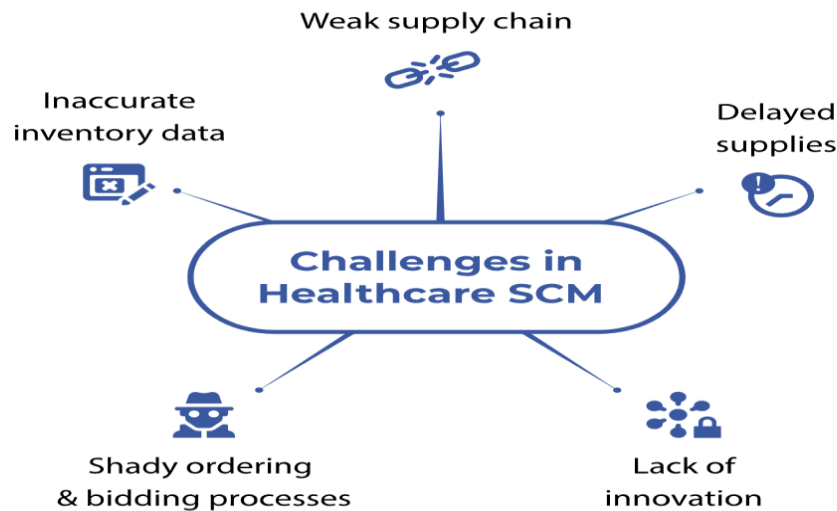


Figure 7: Challenges in SCM in Health care Industry

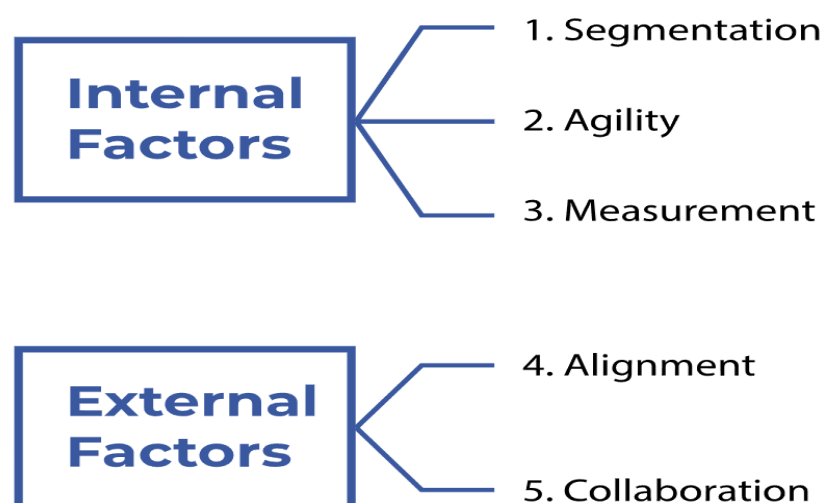


Figure 8: Critical factors for Healthy SCM in Health care Industry
