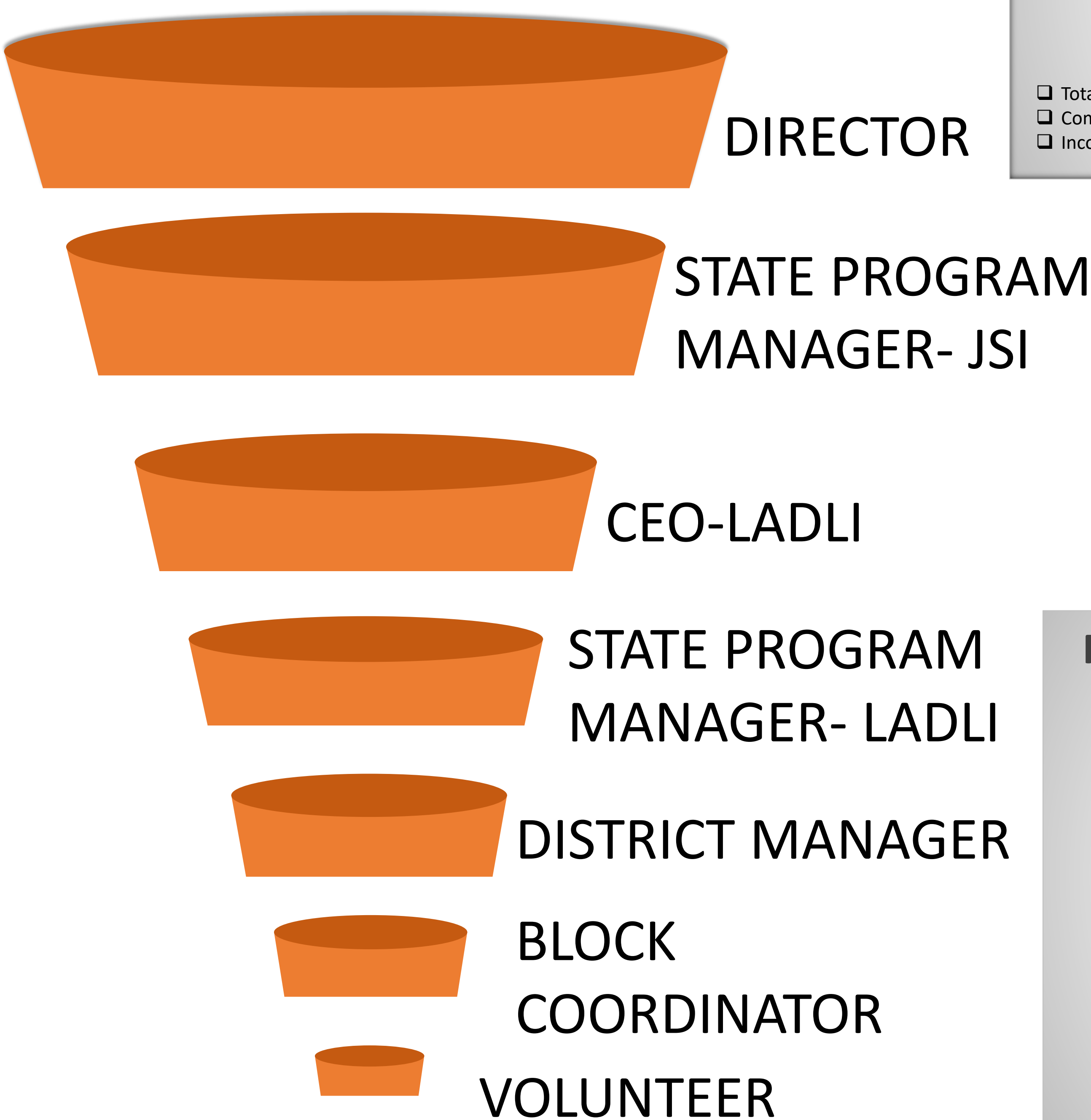

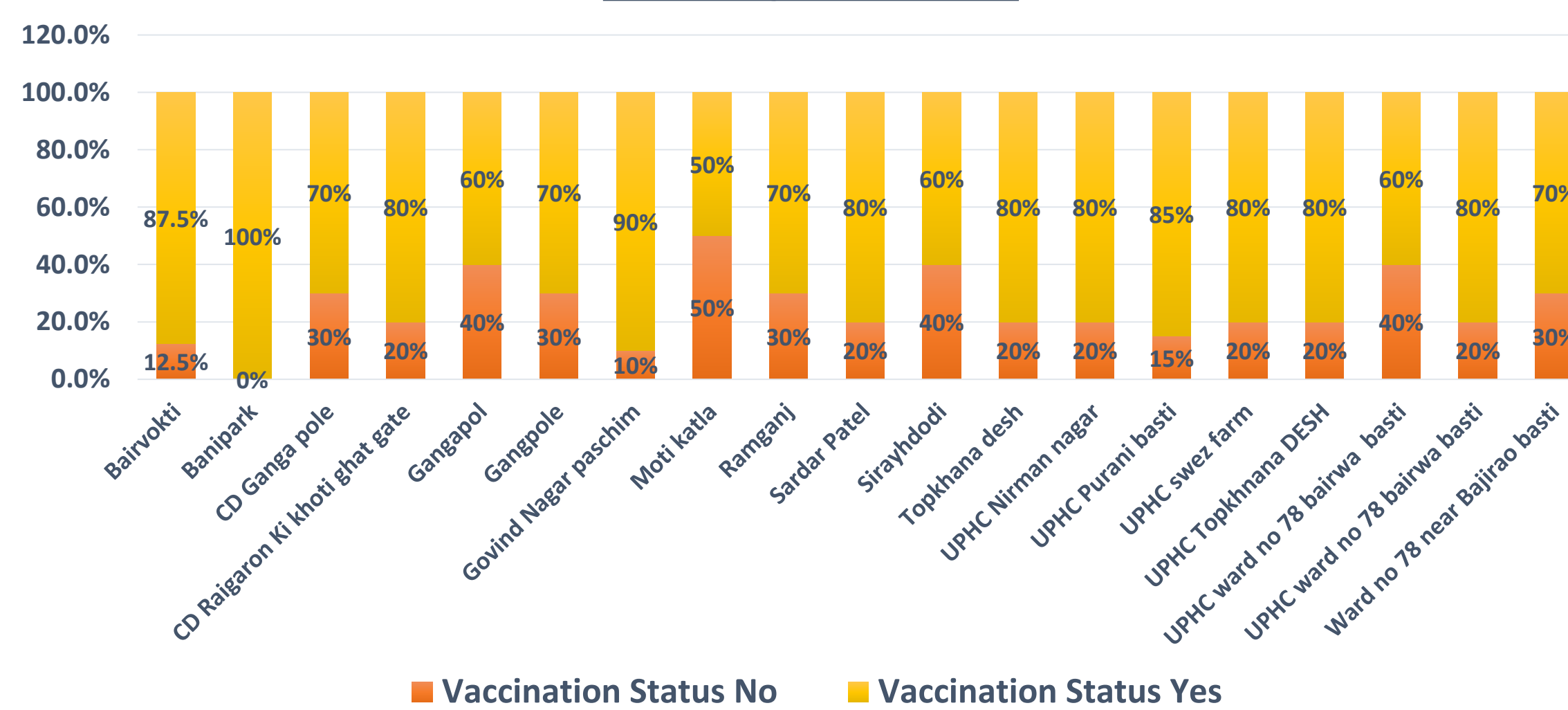
ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

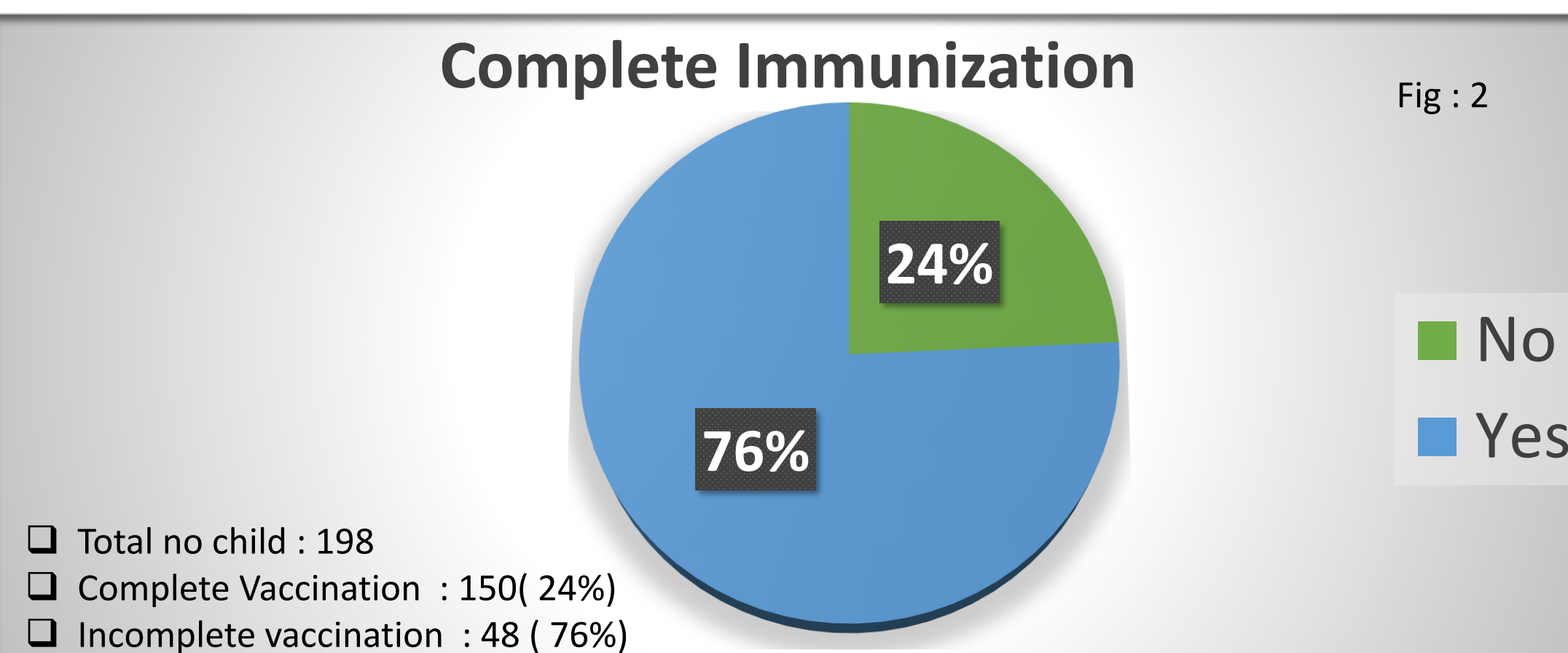

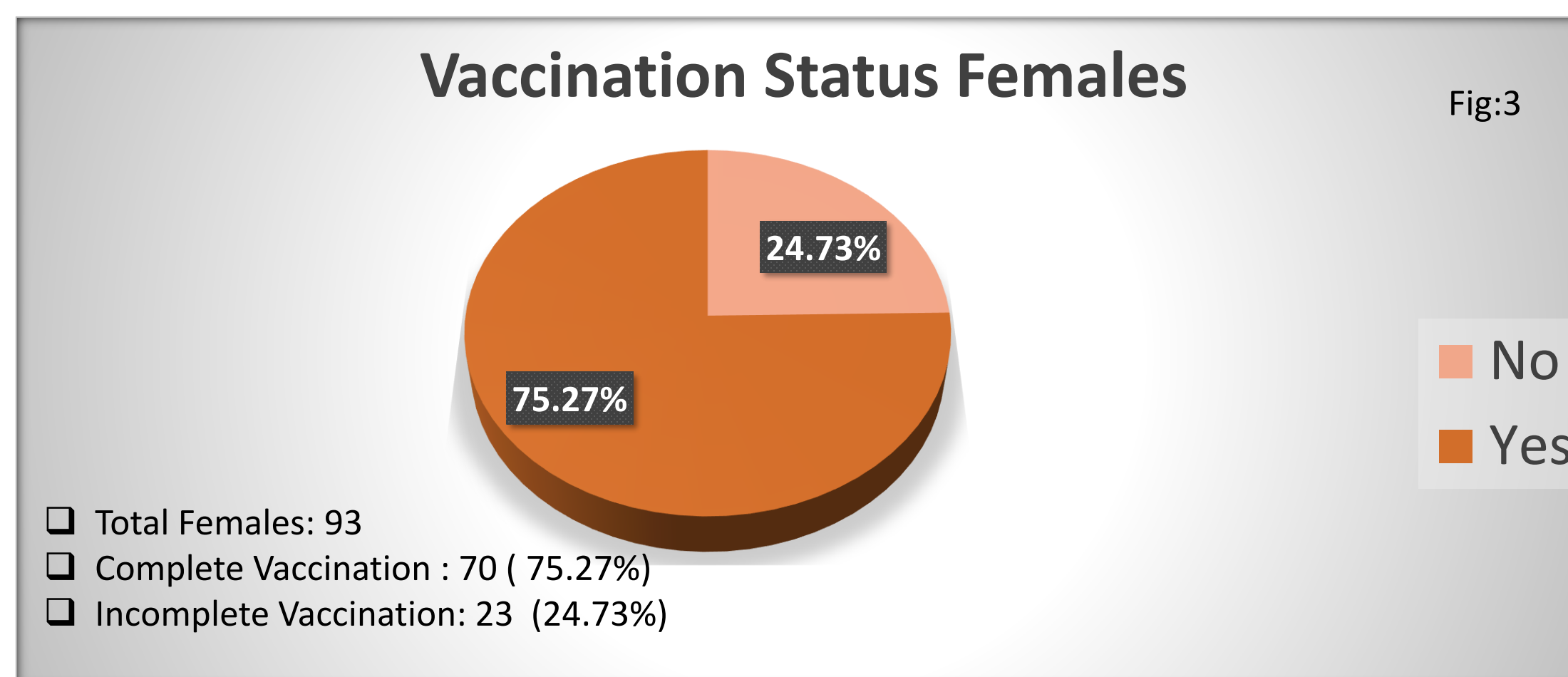

Vaccination Status Based on Gender

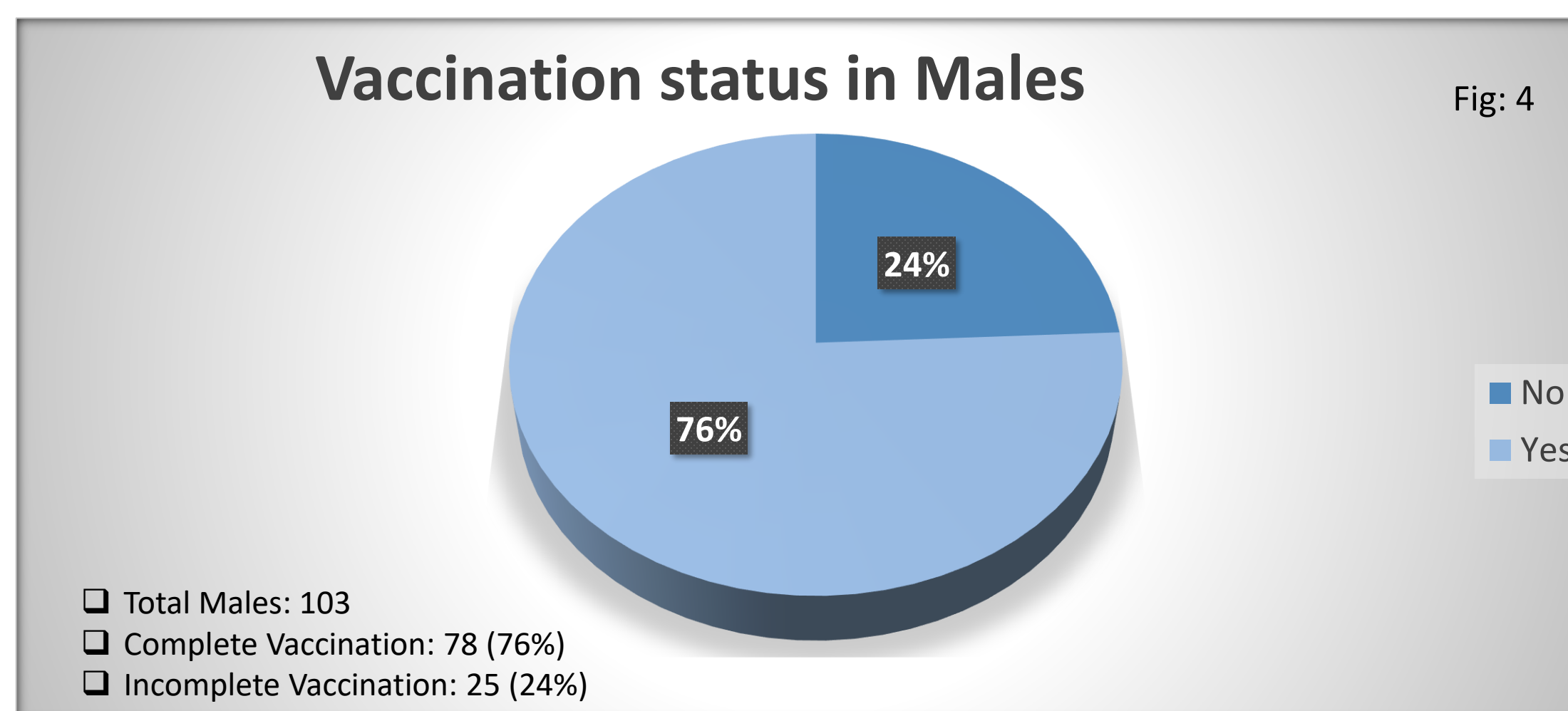
Vaccination Status Females

Vaccination status in Males

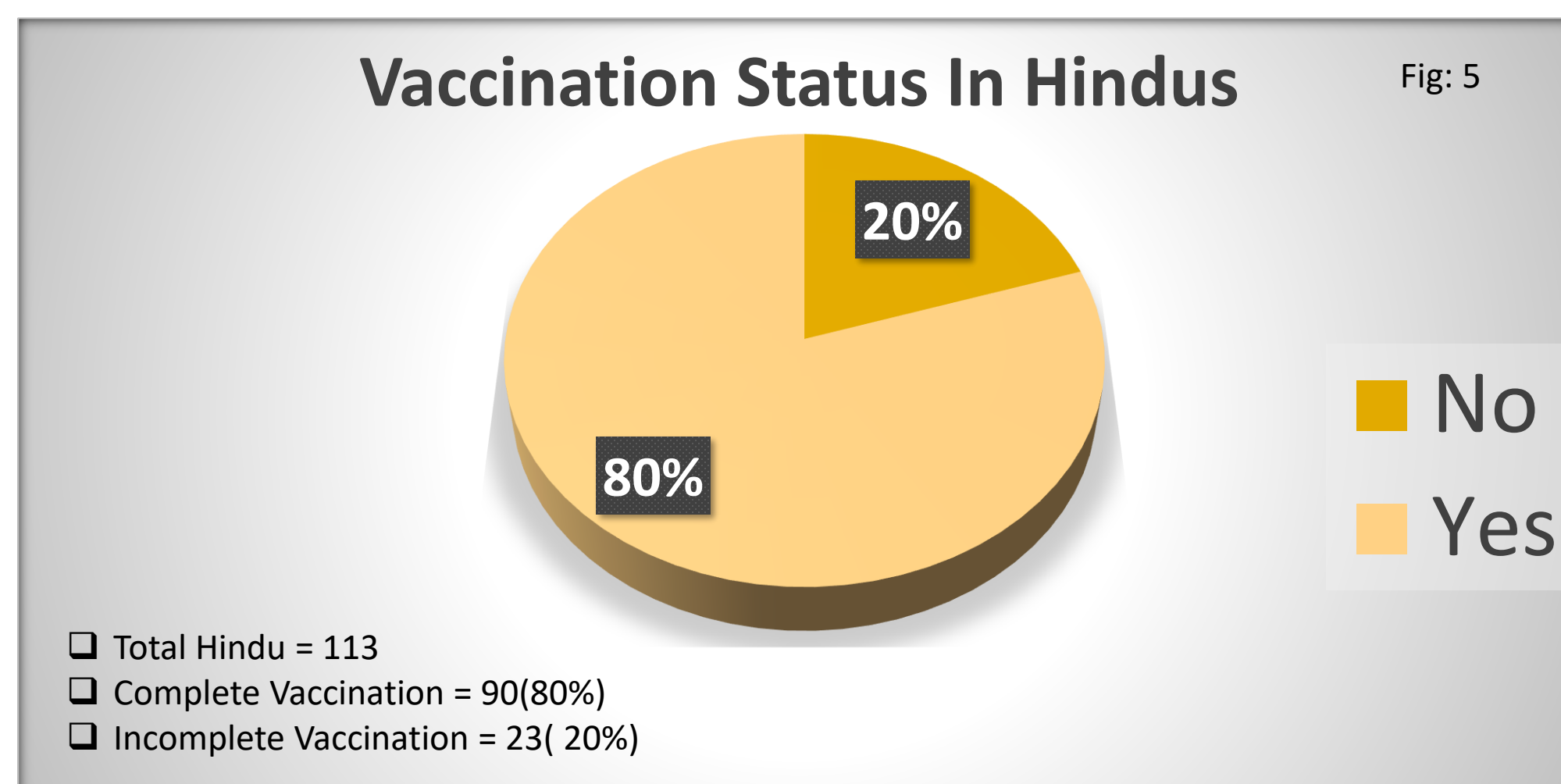

Vaccination Status Based on Religion

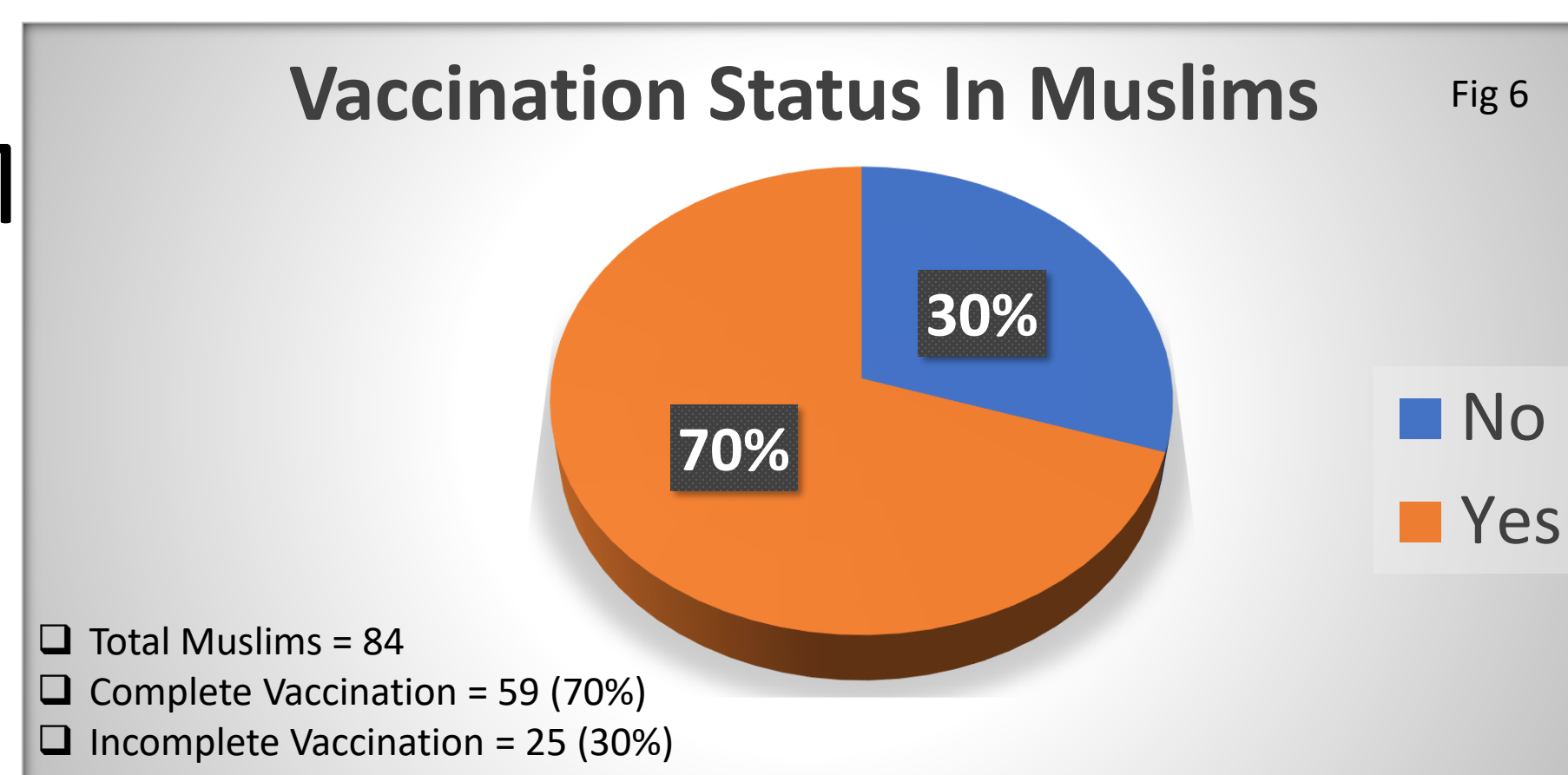

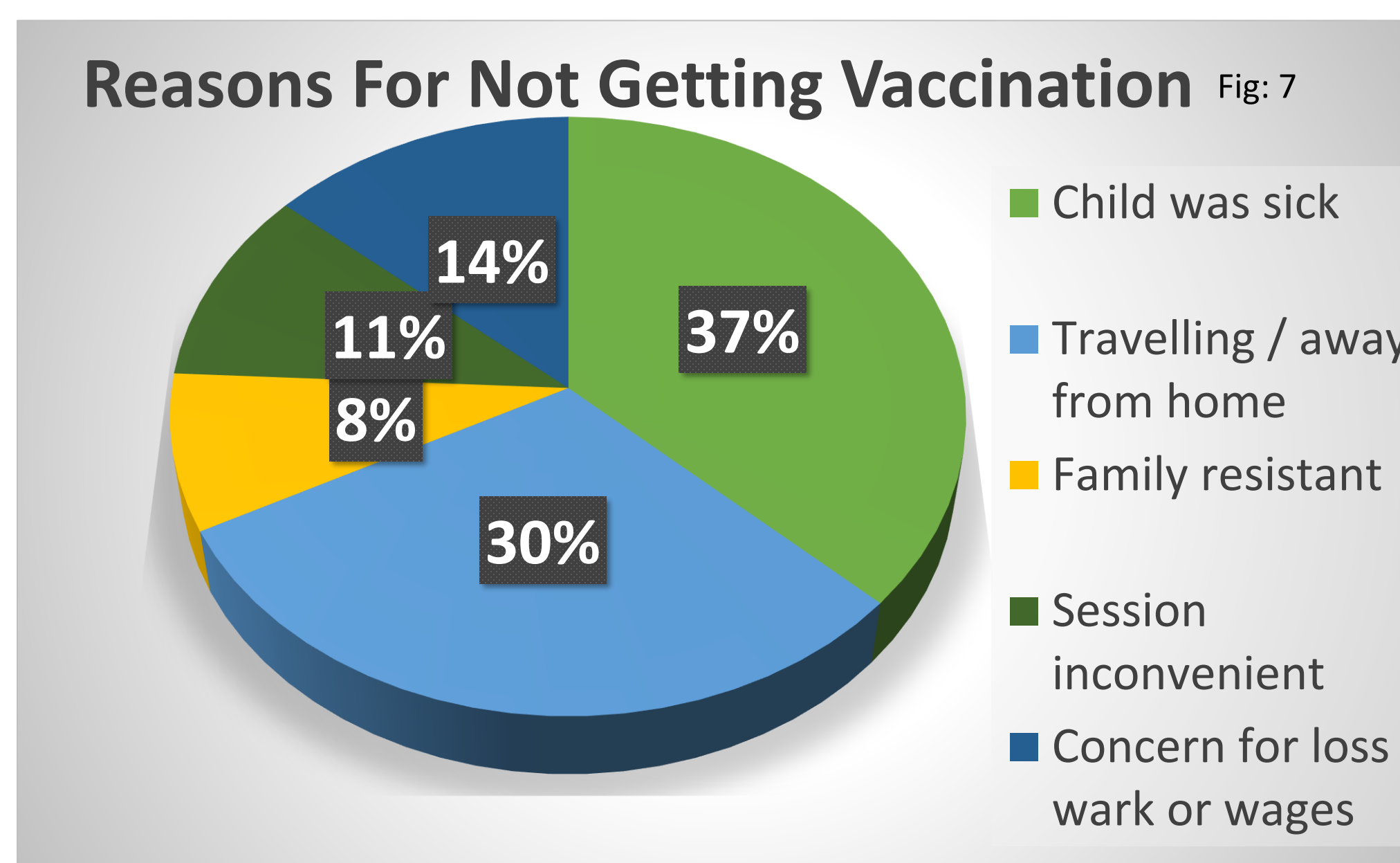
Vaccination Status In Muslims
