

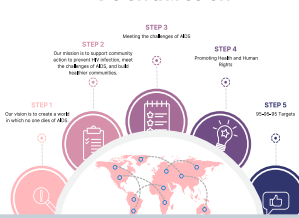

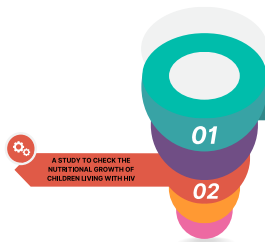


Project Description

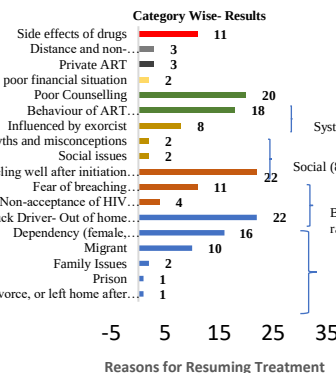
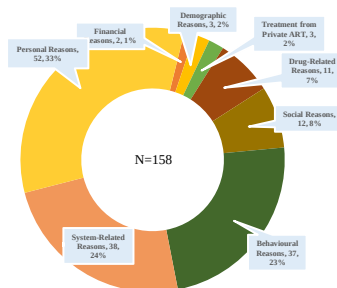
Methodology

- Duration of Study:** 6 month.
- Sample Size:** 158 Clients
- Sample Technique:** Random sampling
- Inclusion Criteria:** PLHIV who disengaged from treatment and were re-engaged to ART.
- Data collection method:** Primary data collection through outreach worker and telephonic.

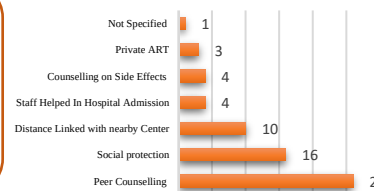
- Duration of Study:** 2 month.
- Sample Size:** 46 Clients
- Inclusion Criteria:** CLHIV in Jind & Rohtak to whom nutritional kits were distributed by Alliance India.
- Data collection method:** A Nutritional assessment tool was created and data was collected by outreach workers.

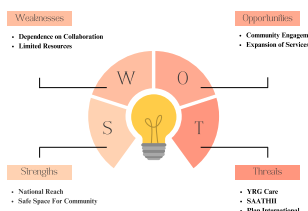
REASONS FOR OPT OUT



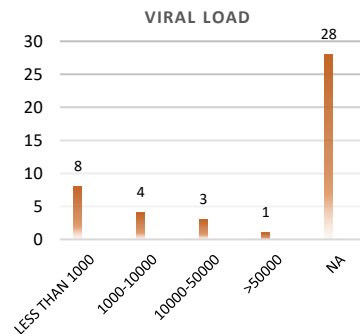
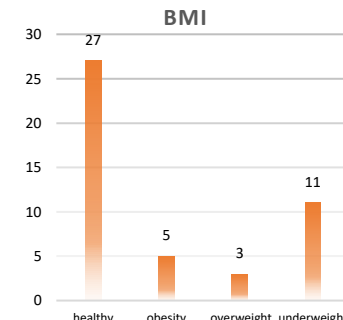
Reasons for Resuming Treatment

Suggestion

- Increase collaboration with government agencies, NGOs, and stakeholders involved in HIV prevention and treatment.
- Develop more Antiretroviral Therapy (ART) Centers and Community Health Centers (CHCs) in areas with high HIV prevalence to ensure adequate access to treatment and care for PLHIV.
- Increase the number of outreach workers, especially in larger states and hilly states with a significant HIV burden, to enhance community-level engagement, awareness, and support.
