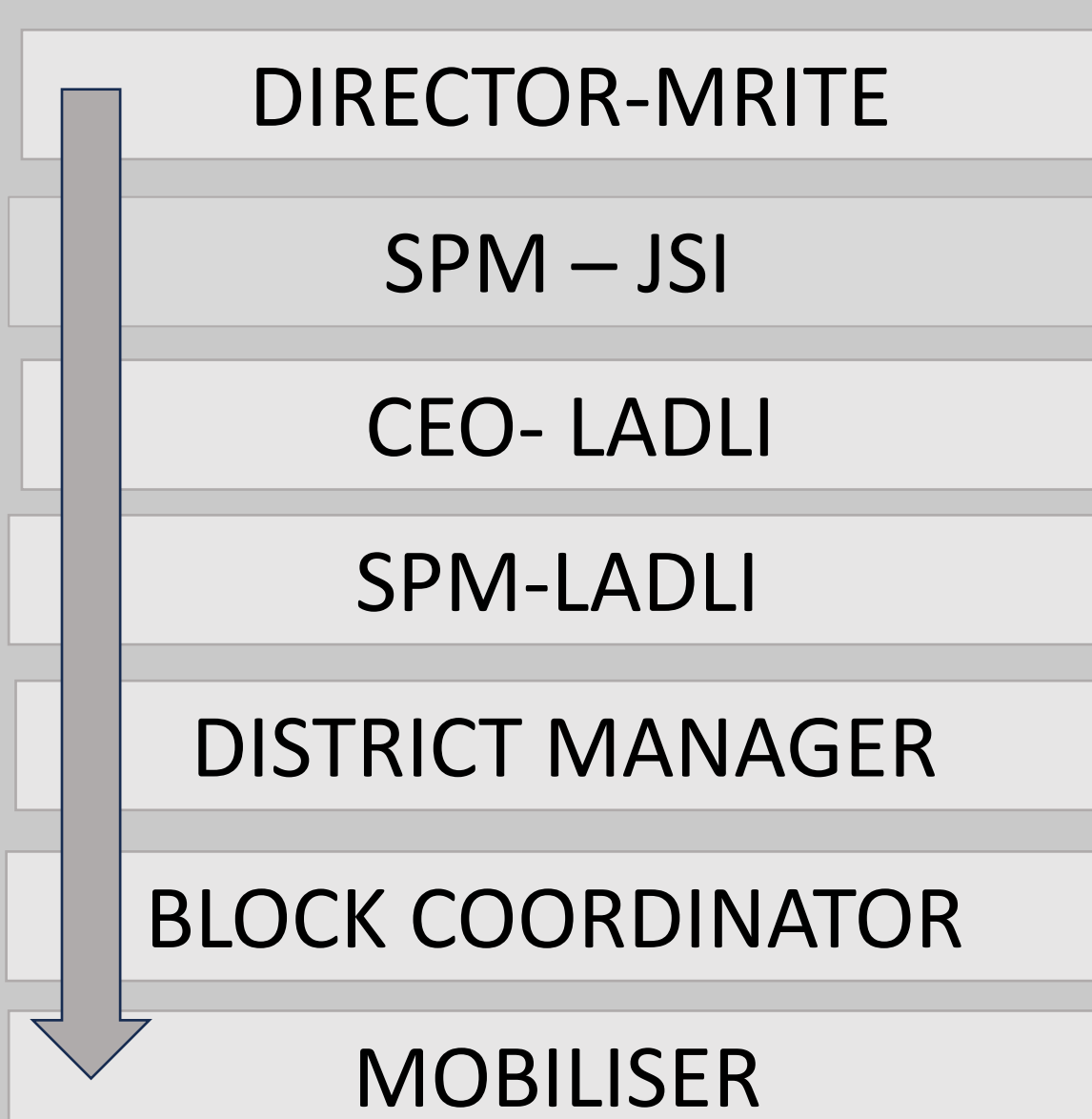
ABOUT THE PROJECT- MRITE-

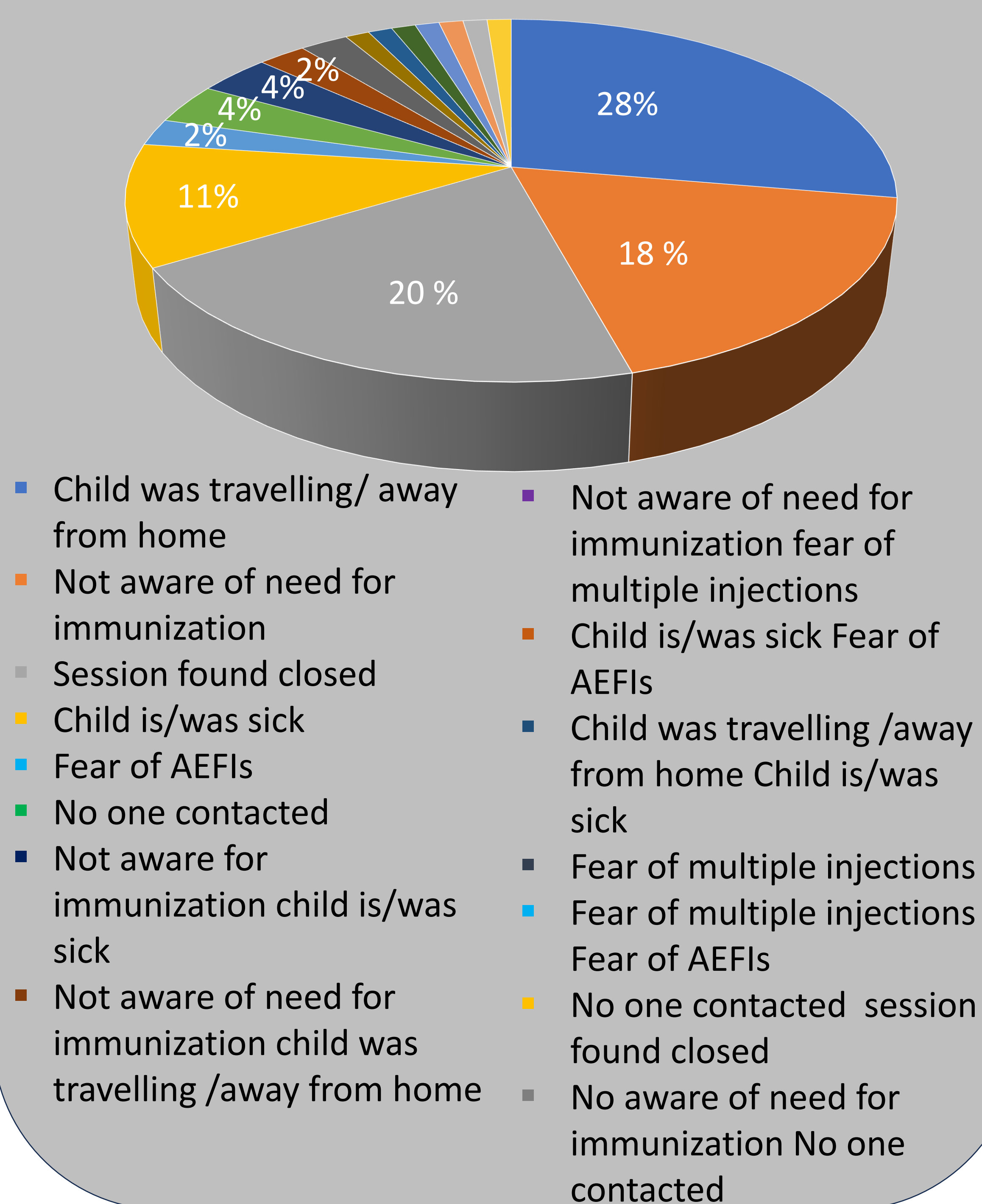

- Visited and learned about UPHCs and its functioning
- Role and responsibilities of ASHAs and ANMs
- Vaccine hesitancy and fear of AEFIs
- Cold Chain and cold chain management system
- Concept of AWC and Mini AW
- Micro plan designing –
Following points should be considered while designing a micro plan-
1.Sessions should not be conducted in open areas
2.Religious places such as temples and masjids should not be selected as session sites
3.Microplan should be designed in such a way that it covers entire ward of that area.

SUGGESTIONS-

- Proper Communication and RI training of both ASHAs and ANMs
- IEC, Videos, Radio advertisements should focus on showing the serious effects of not getting vaccines administered rather than advertisements that focus on the benefits of vaccination
- We need to track all the AEFIs ever happened and openly talk about them with people and gain their trust again
- Mamta cards should be filled properly. A lot of discrepancies have been found in Mamta cards during field visits. The date of each vaccine administered should be filled out carefully.
