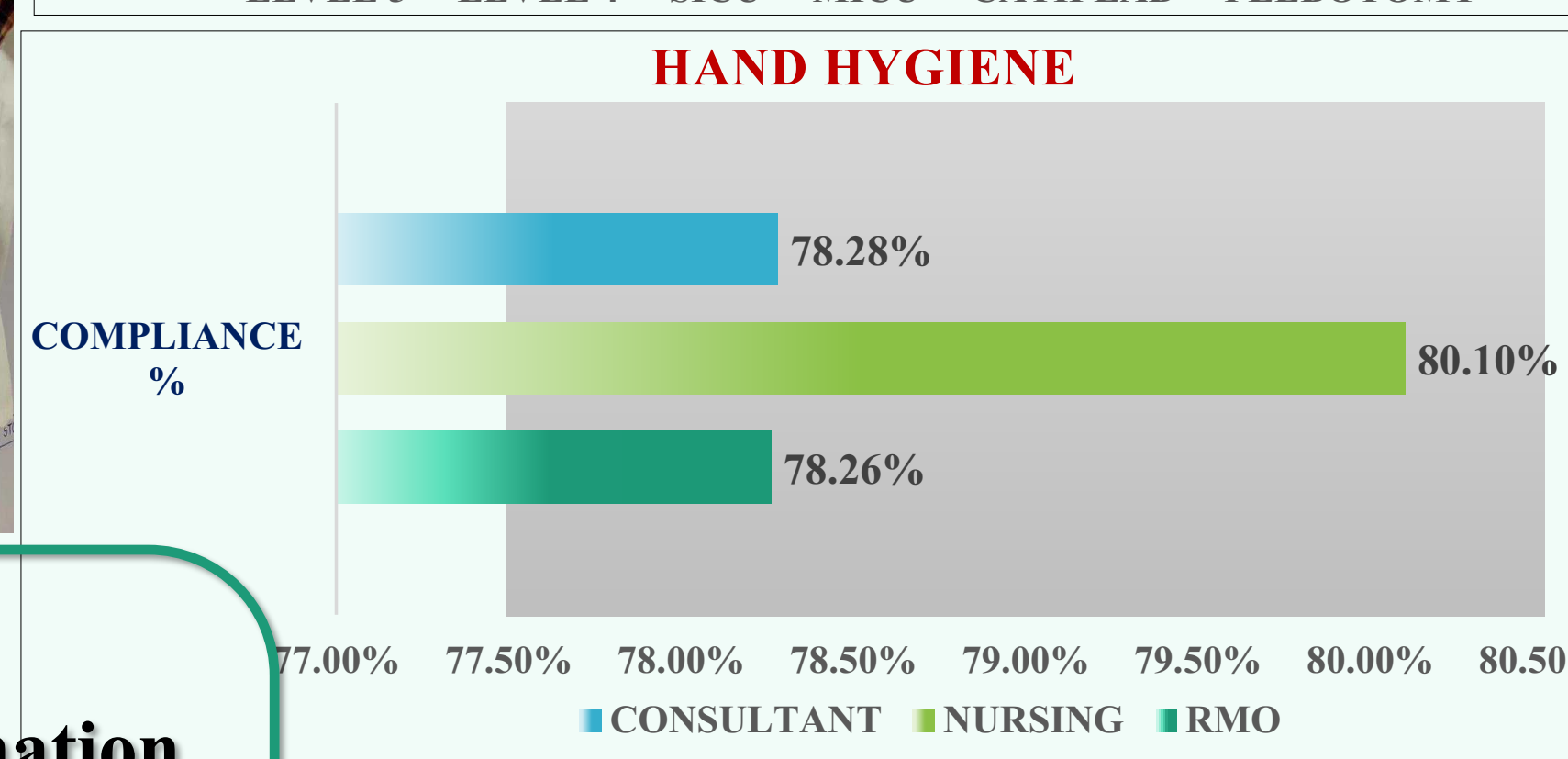
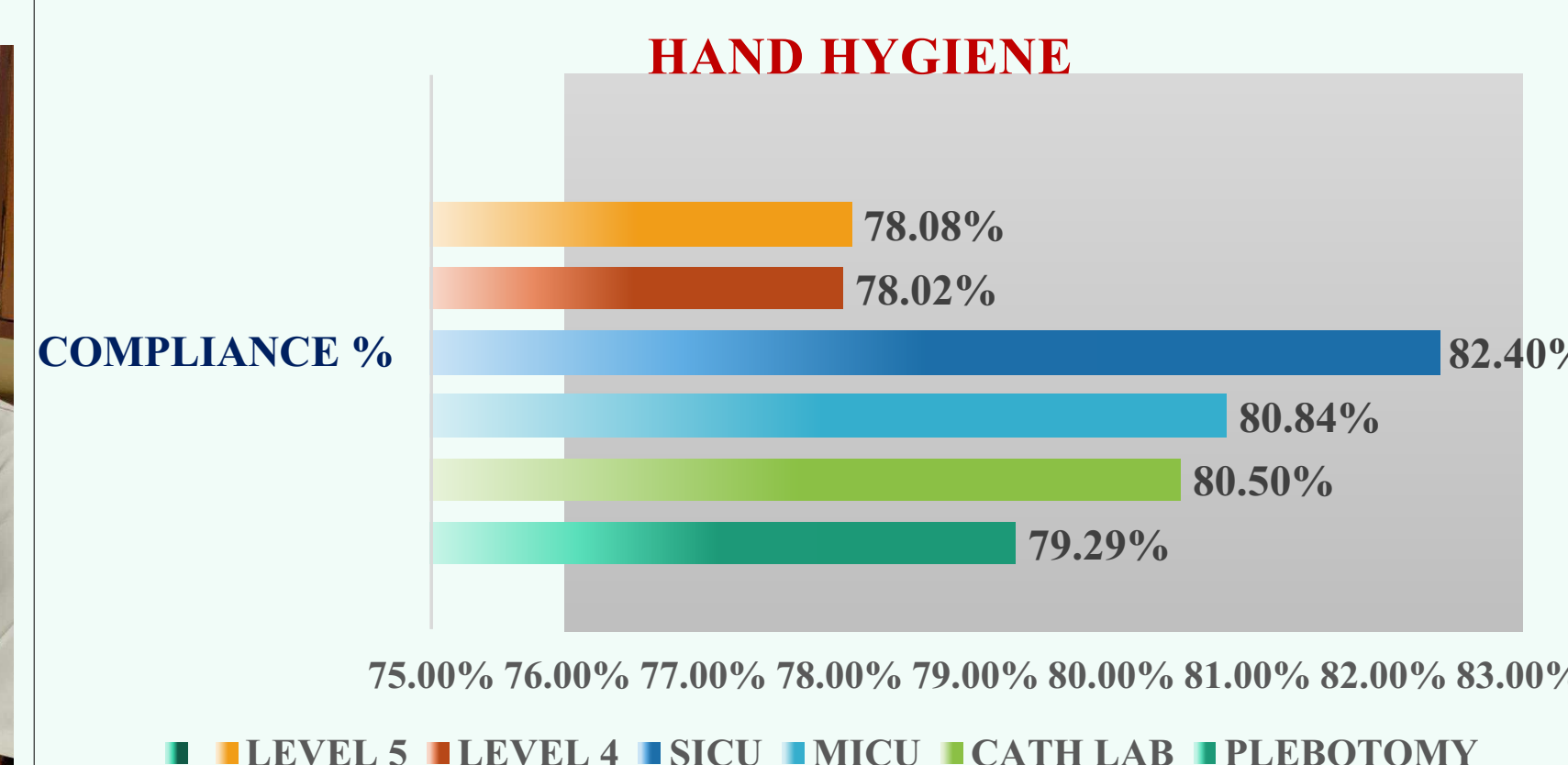
Introduction-
