Classification Methodologies

Regulatory Classification

Classify drugs based on legal regulations (e.g., schedule drugs, over-the-counter) and implement appropriate handling and storage.

Shelf-Life Management

First In, First Out (FIFO)

Prioritize selling products with earlier expiration dates to minimize wastage.

First Expire, First Out (FEFO)

Dispense products with the earliest expiration dates first, regardless of when they were received.

Automated Inventory Systems

Use barcodes or RFID tags for real-time tracking and identification of drug inventory.
