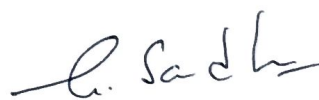

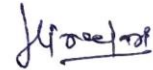

ORGANISATION BRIEF HISTORY

SRKPS was established in 1987 by a group of youth in Mandawa, Jhunjhunu. Their mission was to help rural people by reducing unemployment through informational awareness. Over the years they expanded their help towards women and children, educated the community on family planning and expanded to other Rajasthan districts and were recognized as state-level. Panchayati Raj Institutions were trained and empowered. In 2001 due to rampant sex selection and female foetus elimination promoting gender equality and saving girl children became their priority. Later they promoted tobacco control and PCPNDT and COTPA enforcement. From 2011-2015 they created safer public spaces for women, empowered them to demand quality health care. They then initiated SRKPS Delhi chapter in 2019.

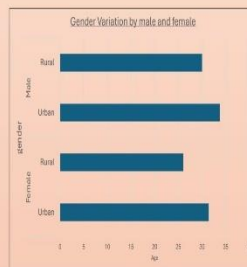
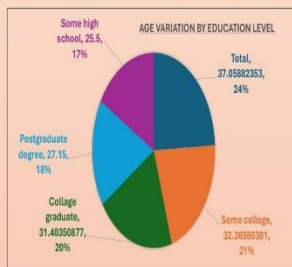

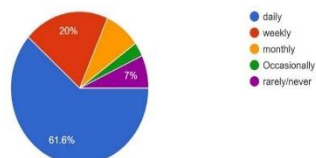
INTRODUCTION

Tobacco products are made entirely or partly of leaf tobacco as raw material, which is intended to be smoked, sucked, chewed, or snuffed. All contain the highly addictive psychoactive ingredient, nicotine. It is claiming the lives of nearly 5.4 million people a year worldwide.¹ Burden in Southeast Asia region is one of the highest among WHO regions.² Estimated number of tobacco users in India is 274.9 million with a lot of regional variation.² One-fifth of all worldwide deaths attributed to tobacco occur in India, more than 8 lakh people die, and 12 million people fall ill due to tobacco each year.

Among other diseases, tobacco use increases the risk for cardiovascular disease, and lung and oral cavity cancers.⁴ Tobacco use accounts for one in six deaths due to non-communicable diseases (NCDs).⁵ In India, tobacco consumption pushes approximately 150 million people into poverty.⁴ Tobacco users who die prematurely deprive their families of income, education, and health care pushing them further into cycle of poverty.

I was involved in various projects and tasks aimed at improving healthcare service delivery and public health outcomes. The internship provided me with an opportunity to apply my academic knowledge in a practical setting. I attended a workshop on the use of geographic information systems in public health planning and completed a training session on the implementation of health information systems. During my internship, i enhanced my data analysis skills using statistical software and improved my report-writing and presentation skills. I gained practical experience in public health program evaluation and developed a deeper understanding of the challenges and opportunities in healthcare delivery. During my summer internship at the SHIKSHIT ROJGAR KRNDRA PRANBANDHAK SAMITI JAIPUR, I worked on various projects aimed at improving healthcare delivery systems. This report aims to bridge the gap between classroom theory and practical experience. During my internship, I learned specific skills about program management, policy development, healthcare financing (about state pip), general management activities. This internship helped me develop strong project management skills as I coordinated with multiple departments to ensure the successful implementation of health initiatives. In my MBA program, I studied several concepts critical to development management. Health systems management taught me about the structure and function of health systems, which was crucial in understanding the operations at SRKPS. While theoretical models suggest a linear approach to implementing health policies, i found that in practice, factors such as local politics and resource availability often require a more flexible approach.

Gaps identified in the working area during your summer internship at the SHIKSHIT ROJGAR KENDRA PRANBANDHAK SAMITI JAIPUR is a critical aspect of your internship report. Here are some potential gaps i have identified, along with a structured way to present them:

Gaps in training and development

Another significant gap was the insufficient training programs for employees. Many staff members lacked the necessary skills to effectively use the new digital health records system, resulting in its underutilization.

Inadequate staffing: highlight issues related to insufficient staffing levels, which may lead to overburdened employees and reduced efficiency.

Insufficient training programs: identify the need for more comprehensive training programs for employees to keep them updated with the latest healthcare practices and technologies.

Outdated technology: discuss the use of outdated technology that hampers efficient data management and service delivery.

Lack of strategic planning: highlight the absence of a long-term strategic plan for health initiatives and services.

- *Example:* there was no clear long-term strategy for expanding health services to underserved areas.

Policy implementation issues: identify gaps in the implementation and monitoring of health policies.

- *Example:* policies related to patient safety and quality of care were not effectively implemented or monitored.

Coordination with external stakeholders' challenges in coordinating with external partners, such as other healthcare providers or government agencies. Also, institute lacks in multi- sectorial approach and coordination with other government health institute and department.

Example: there were difficulties in coordinating with local health agencies and NGOs for the implementation of community health programs.

Lack of continuing education opportunities: emphasize the importance of continuous professional development and the gaps in providing such opportunities. There were limited workshops or seminars available for staff to enhance their skills and knowledge.

Suggestion

Here are some suggestions for improvement you could propose at SRKPS, Jaipur, based on my experience as a summer intern and MBA development management student.

Comprehensive training: develop regular, comprehensive training programs for all staff to ensure they are up to date with the latest healthcare practices and technologies. Like, introduce mandatory training sessions on the new digital health records system to ensure all staff can use it effectively.

External collaboration: foster stronger partnerships with external stakeholders, including other healthcare providers, government agencies, and non-governmental organizations.

Effective policy implementation: ensure that health policies are effectively implemented and monitored through regular evaluations and feedback mechanisms. Set up a policy implementation task force to oversee the rollout and assessment of new health policies.

Invest in community outreach and public health initiatives: - strengthen community health programs to address local health issues and improve public health outcomes. Increase public awareness about available health services and encourage community participation in health programs.

Provide continuous training for healthcare workers. Focus on skill development of community health workers (ASHA, ANMS)

Regularly train healthcare staff on cold chain management, patient communication, and vaccine Administration. Ascertain the availability of necessary supplies, drugs, and equipment at healthcare facilities offering beemoc. Upgrades to the operating theatre,

Postnatal care facilities, and delivery rooms should be funded in order to support obstetric care.

Encourage healthy behaviours in children from an early age by incorporating health education into School curriculum.

Provide trainings for health care workers.

Also, more training should be held on ground level rather than having them in institute. Community based initiatives that help and educate people.
