3. RESEARCH QUESTION: What are the factors contributing to the increase in medico legal cases in emergency room settings?

4. OBJECTIVES:

- To assess the frequency and types of medico legal cases encountered in emergency rooms.
- To investigate the factors contributing to medico legal cases in emergency room settings.
- To compare the outcomes of medico legal cases based on different patient demographics.
- To analyze the impact of medico legal cases on healthcare providers and institutions.
- To propose recommendations for improving the handling of medico legal cases in emergency rooms

5. HYPOTHESIS:

H1: The frequency of medico legal cases in emergency rooms is higher in urban settings compared to rural areas.

H2: Medico legal cases involving paediatric patients have different outcomes compared to cases involving adult patients.

H3: Proper documentation practices by healthcare providers can reduce the incidence of medico legal cases in emergency rooms.

6. MATERIAL AND METHODS:

STUDY DESIGN: The study will utilize a mixed-methods approach, both quantitative and qualitative data. Quantitative data will be gathered through the analysis of ER records and case outcomes, while qualitative data will be obtained from interviews and surveys with ER staff.

SETTING: The study will be conducted in the emergency room of hospital.

STUDY POPULATION

- **INCLUSION CRITERIA:**
 - Patients who presented to the emergency room and were involved in a medico legal case.
 - Healthcare providers who are involved in managing medico legal cases.
 - Legal professionals handling medico legal cases in the emergency room setting.
- **EXCLUSION CRITERIA:**
 - Patients who were not involved in a medico legal case during their emergency room visit.
 - Healthcare providers and legal professionals not directly involved in medico legal cases in the emergency room.
 - Patients and staff who do not consent to participate in the study.
- **STUDY TOOLS:** The study will utilize structured interview schedules for healthcare providers and legal professionals. Questionnaires for patients involved in medico legal cases. Diagnostic tests if required to assess the medical aspects of the cases.

DURATION OF STUDY: The study will be conducted over a period of 3 months 1st April 2024 to 30th June 2024.

SAMPLE SIZE: The study will include all patients who presented to the ER and were involve in medico legal cases during the study.

SAMPLING TECHNIQUE: A purposive sampling technique will be used to select relevant cases that meet the criteria for inclusion in the study. Sample size calculation will be based on the estimated frequency of medico legal cases.

DATA COLLECTION PROCEDURE:

- Conducting structured interviews and administering questionnaires.
- Reviewing medical records and legal documents.
- Analysing data using appropriate statistical methods and qualitative analysis.

OPERATIONAL DEFINITIONS:

- Medico-Legal Case (MLC): Any case presented in the emergency room where there is a legal aspect involved, requiring documentation for legal purposes (e.g., assault, road traffic accidents, work-related injuries).
- Documentation Practices: The method in which healthcare professionals record details of medico-legal cases, including patient information, incident details, treatment provided, and legal notes.
- Specialized Medico-Legal Unit: A dedicated team within the emergency room trained to handle medico-legal cases, ensuring compliance with legal and medical standards.

7. DATA ANALYSIS PLAN:

- Data analysis will involve descriptive statistics, frequency distributions, Qualitative data analysis techniques will also be employed to gain insights from interviews and legal documents.
- Quantitative Analysis: Descriptive statistics to categorize and quantify the types of MLCs. Comparative analysis using chi-square tests or t-tests to evaluate outcomes between specialized units and general ER staff.
- Qualitative Analysis: Interview and survey data to identify common challenges and proposed solutions.

8. ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS: Informed consent will be obtained from all participants. Data security, privacy, and confidentiality will be maintained by anonymizing participant data and securely storing records.
