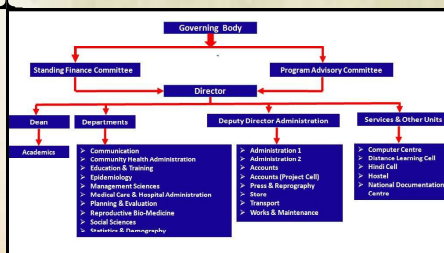

Charting the path to progress in health development: Participation of corporates to achieve Sustainable development goals by 2030.

INTRODUCTION

Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) plays a crucial role in India's strategy to achieve Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030. This study critically examines how CSR initiatives support the Government of India's flagship programs, focusing on health improvement, poverty reduction, hunger reduction, and clean water & sanitation. This review study focuses on what is presently done by companies in their CSR activities and what needs to be done to achieve SDG by 2030. Using recent data on CSR spending trends across these sectors, this paper explores the contributions of corporate efforts towards sustainable development, highlighting these areas.

OBJECTIVES

- To understand initiatives taken by Govt. of India to achieve SDG for Health in terms of Flagship Programmes
- The Role of CSR participation in supporting these Initiatives to achieve SDG for Health
- Critically analyze what needs to be done to achieve SDG by 2030 in the participation of Corporate & Govt. Of India

METHODOLOGY

This study employs a qualitative research methodology, type of research is exploratory research on desk review, this study utilizing secondary data from articles, corporate CSR reports, government publications, websites and relevant academic literature. Data of CSR spending from 2017-2022 is used to assess the trends of CSR spending on various development sectors. The study also reviews existing literature to identify gaps and challenges in CSR contributions towards flagship government programs.

RESULTS

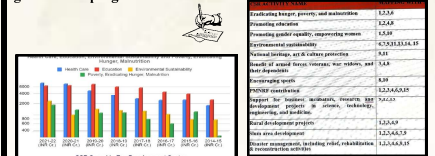
-Government Initiatives for Health SDG- Flagship programs such as Ayushman Bharat, NHM, PM-JAY, PMSMA, Mission Indradhanush, and Swachh Bharat are integral to achieving health-related SDGs. These programs provide comprehensive healthcare services, improve maternal and child health, ensure proper nutrition, and promote sanitation and hygiene.

- Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives play a crucial role in supporting these government programs by funding healthcare infrastructure, organizing health camps, ensuring the provision of clean water and sanitation, and supporting nutrition initiatives. Collaborations between the corporate sector and the government significantly enhance the reach and efficacy of health programs.

-To achieve the Sustainable Development Goals by 2030, it is essential to enhance data collection mechanisms, strengthen public-private partnerships, increase CSR contributions, conduct more research, and provide better training for CSR leaders. Identifying existing gaps and addressing them through collaborative efforts is vital for success.

CONCLUSION

The study highlights significant corporate contributions to health, poverty, hunger, clean water & sanitation through CSR initiatives. However, the alignment of these efforts with specific government flagship programs remains insufficiently documented. To maximize the impact of CSR on achieving SDGs by 2030, it is recommended that companies enhance transparency in their CSR activities, focus on long-term sustainable projects, and improve coordination with government programs.
