Practical exposure at SIP Organisation

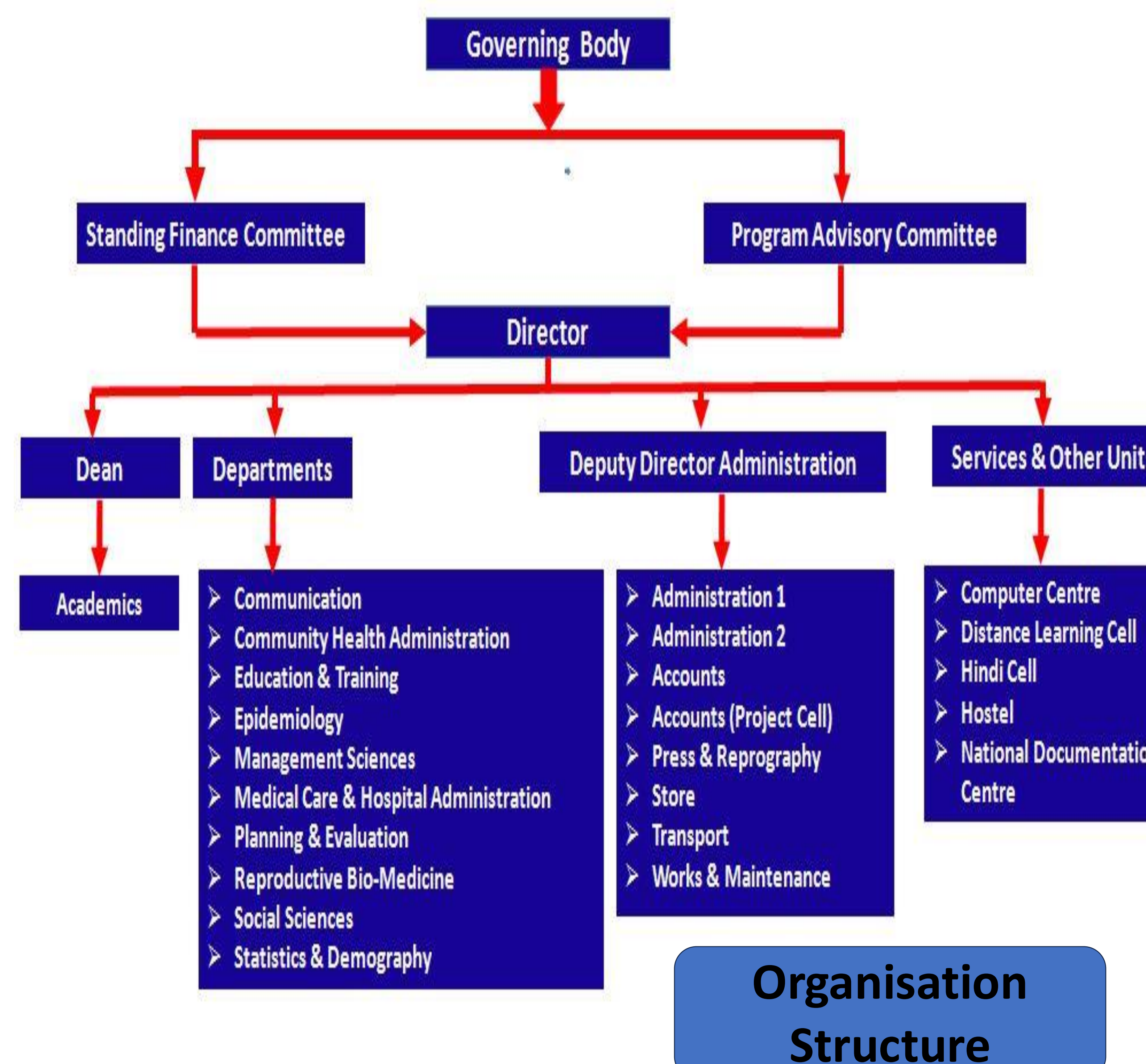
Gained hands on experience in conducting systematic review in healthcare, working closely with experts in understandings of public healthcare systems, health informatics and policy development

Permission to use NIHFW data were often difficult to obtain, hindering comprehensive research and analysis.

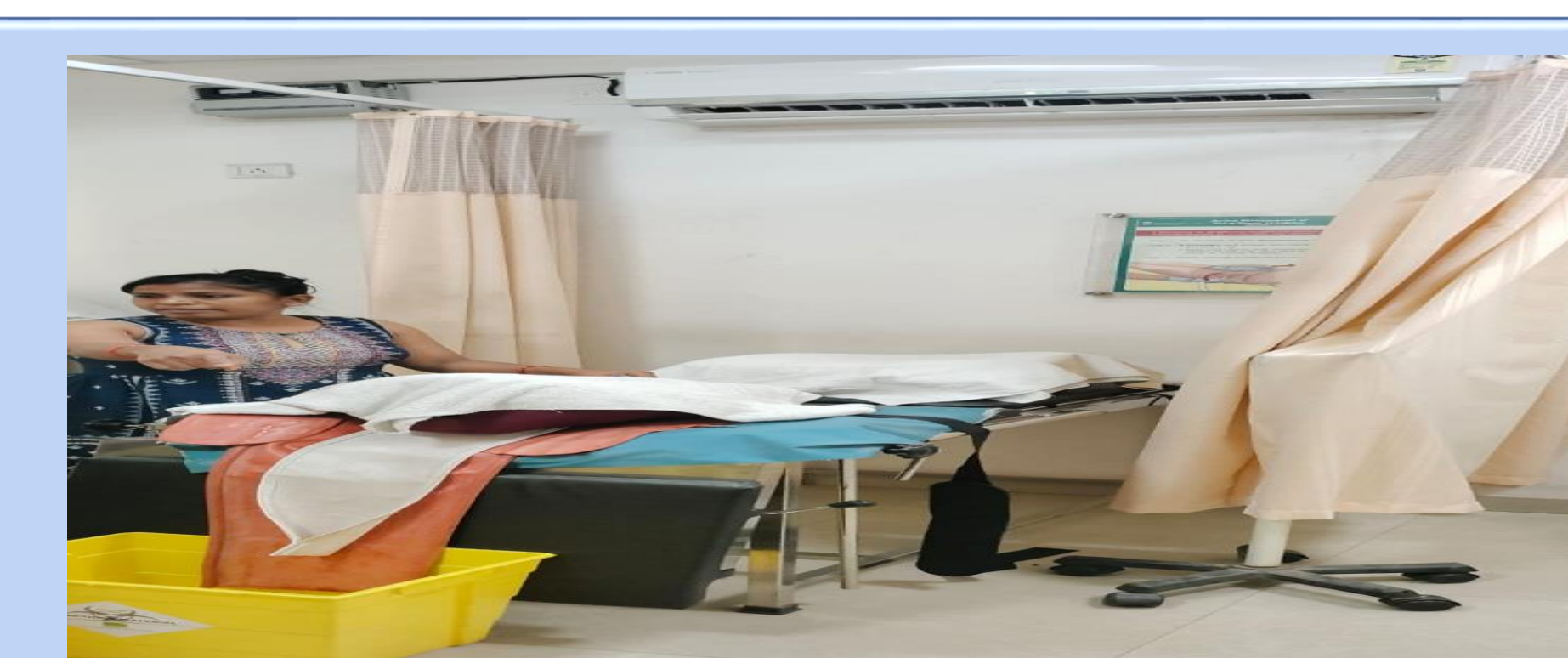
Learning during internship
