NHM brought together two major health initiatives: the National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) and the National Urban Health Mission (NUHM).

History -

The National Rural Health Mission (NRHM), now under National Health Mission is an initiative undertaken by the government of India Prime Minister Manmohan Singh. The decision dated 1 May 2013, has approved the launch of the National Urban Health Mission (NUHM) as a Sub-mission of an overarching National Health Mission (NHM), with National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) being the other Sub-mission of National Health Mission.

The NHM provides the achievement of universal access to equitable, affordable & quality healthcare services that are accountable and responsive to people's needs.

Mission -

Is to improve the availability of and access to quality health care by people, especially for those residing in rural areas, the poor, women, and children.

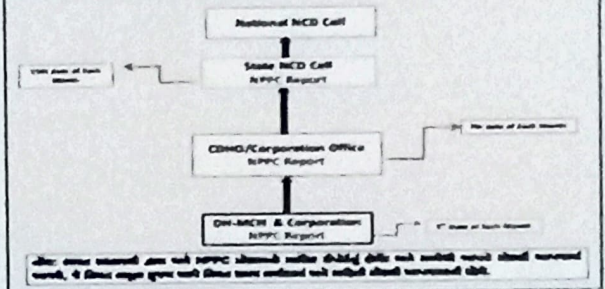
About my work done in NHM -

Monitoring of all schemes from time to time and motivate patients with special health camps to aware about their disease.

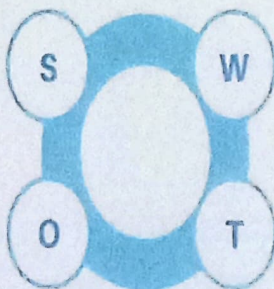
Usefulness Of Internship -
