

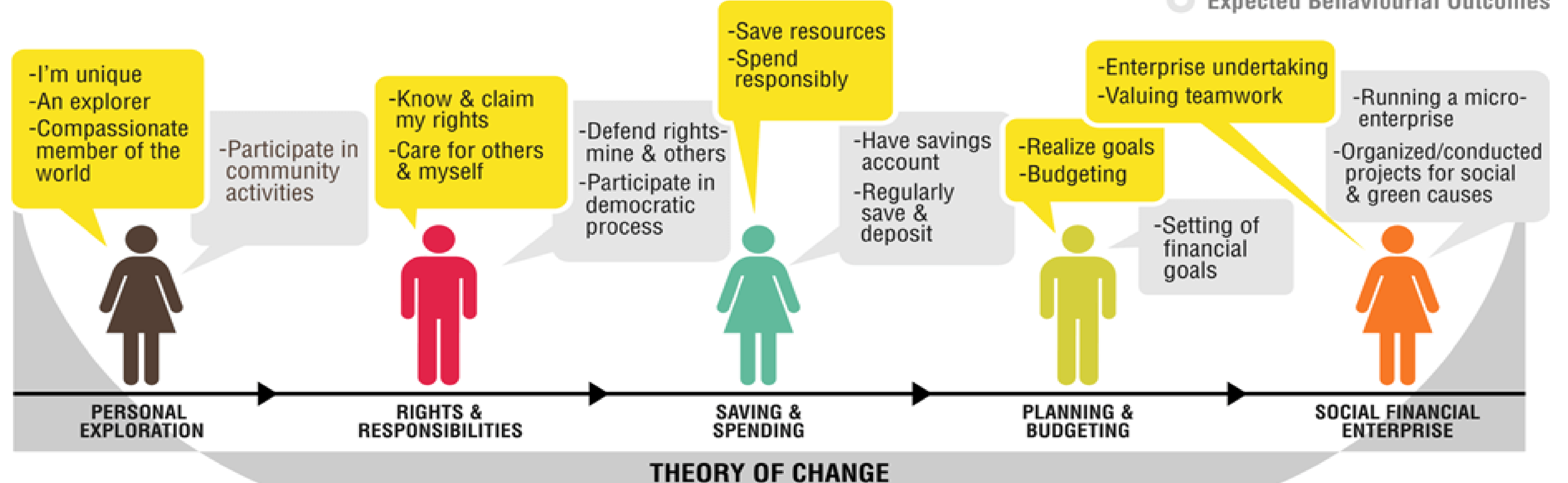
PARTICIPATION BEHAVIOUR & WORKING PATTERN OF BOYS & GIRLS UNDER THE FELS PROGRAM

•**Study Duration:** 2 months.

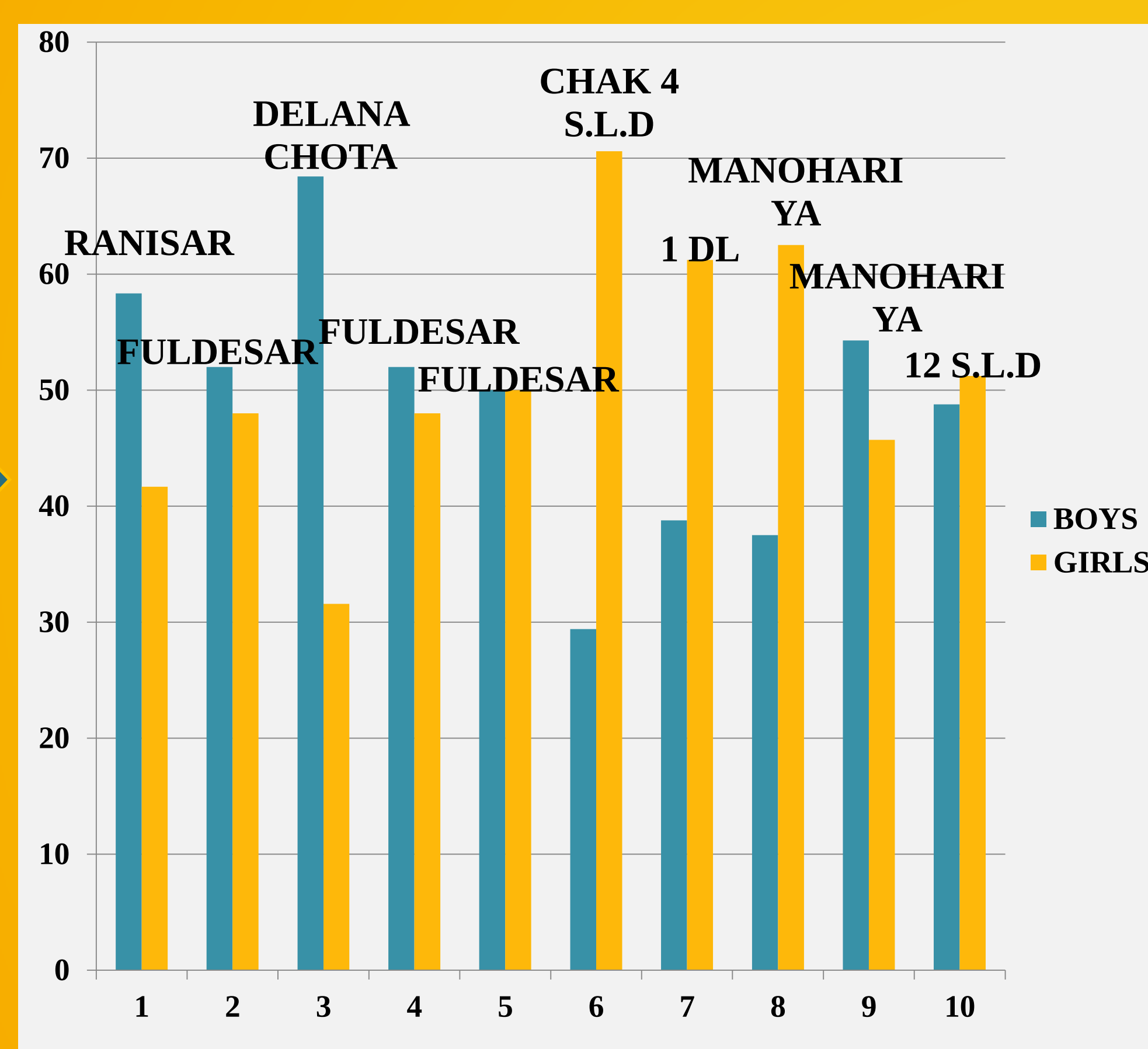
•**Data Source:** Primary Data/Secondary Data.

- Case study

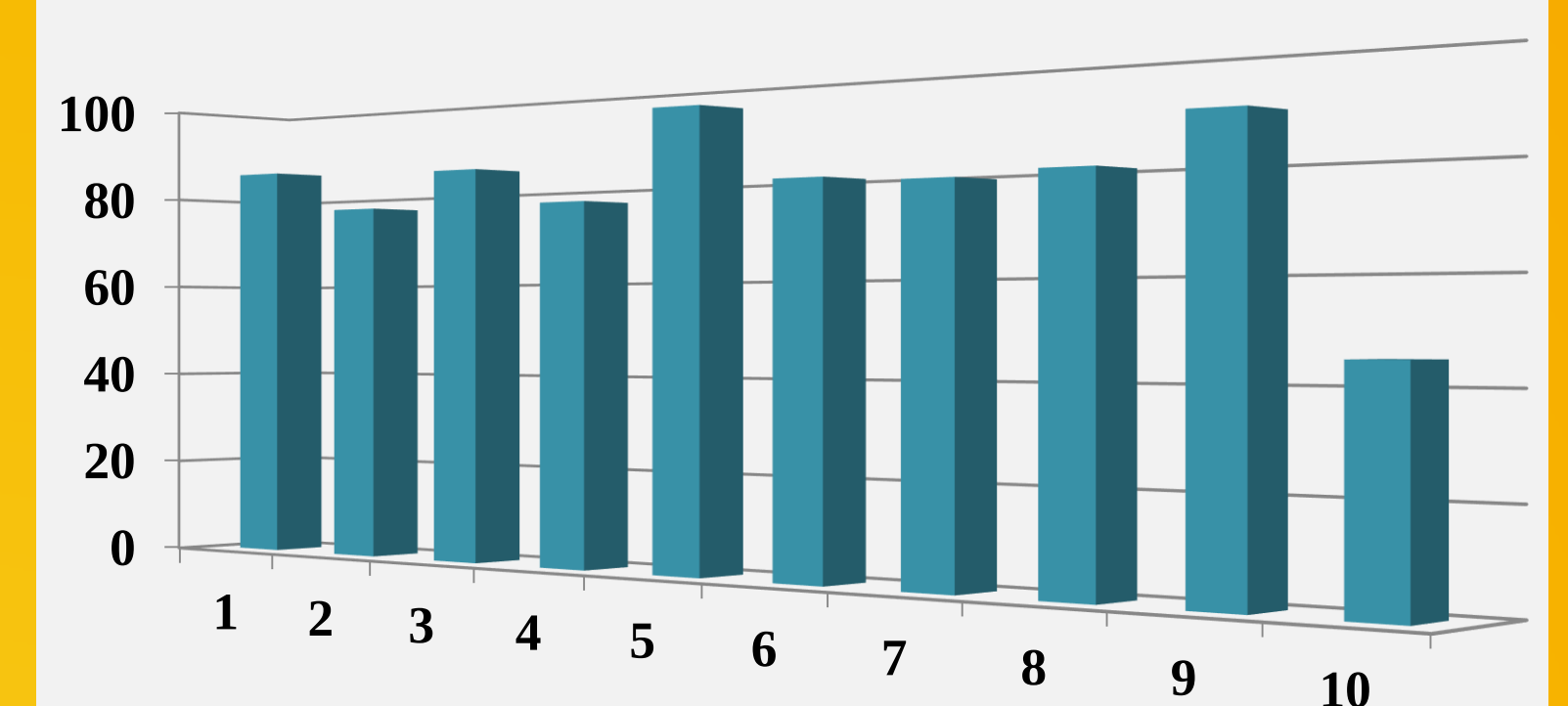

•The percentage of participation in “Bal club of girls and boys

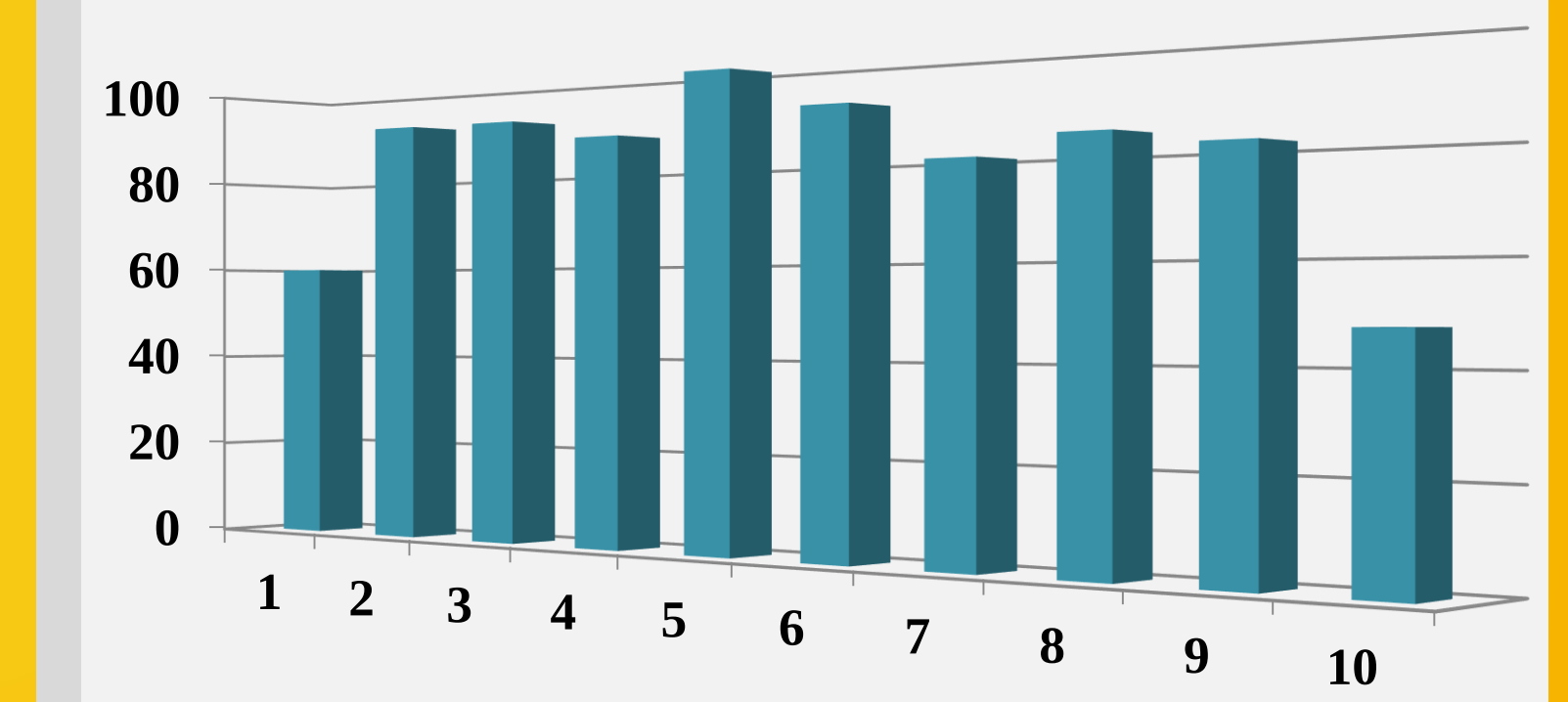


MEMBERS PARTICIPATE IN 'BAL CLUB'	BOYS	GIRLS

PRESENT BOYS



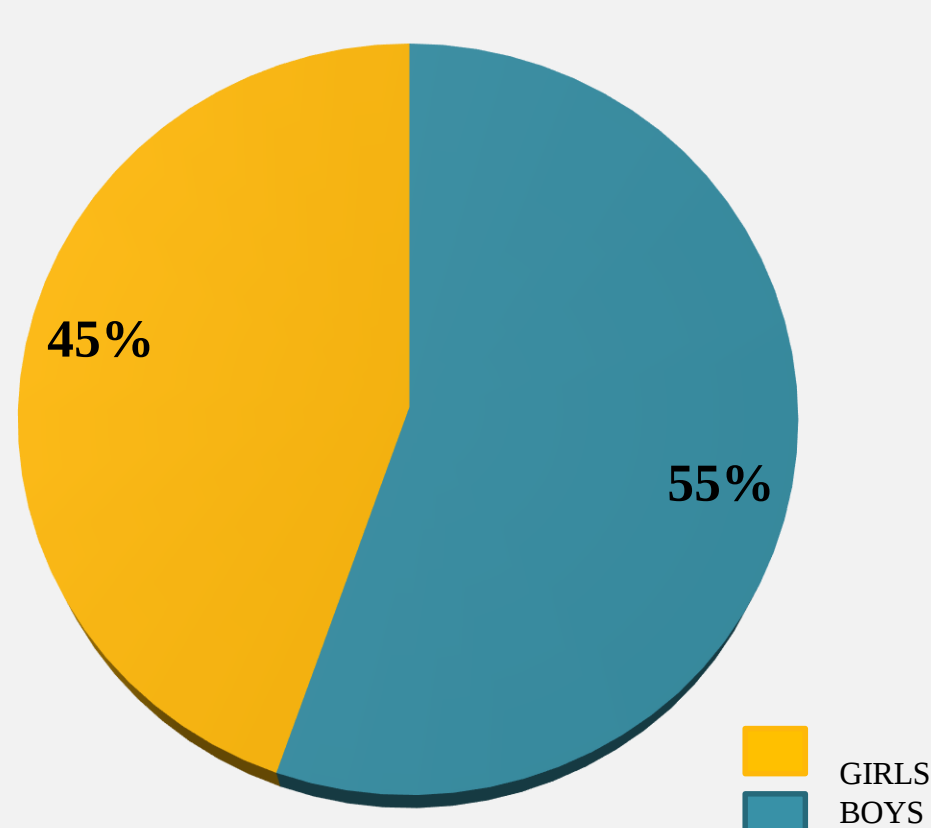
PRESENT GIRLS



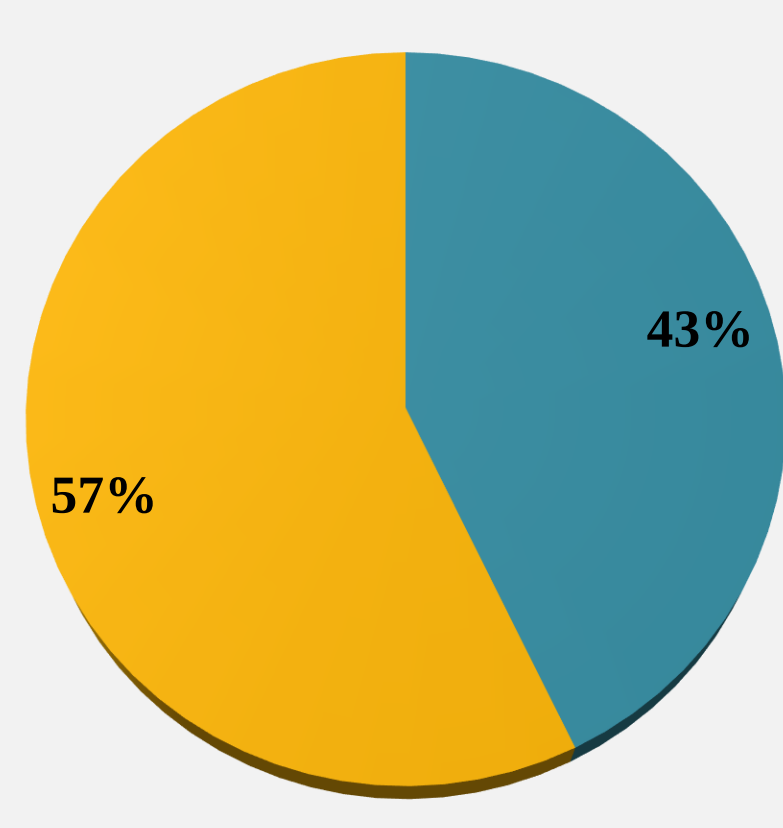

- Dropout rate in the upper primary school is high as compare to primary schools because of child labour, child abuse etc.
- Requirements and responsibility of primary school student is less as compared to upper primary school student.
